Selectors named a 16-man squad, with Katich, Bracken and express bowler Brett Lee the only additions to the team, which lost last month's Test series in India.

Australia will play a five-Test series against England. A 14-man squad was announced for a preceding one-day tournament also featuring Pakistan.

Bracken, a 23-year-old from New South Wales, was sent to India for the one-day series which Steve Waugh's team won 3-2, impressing the selectors enough to be preferred to Michael Kasprowicz, who made the last Ashes

He has captured 10 wickets at 30.30 in nine one-day internationals but has yet to play a Test. He will be the fifth fast bowler in the squad along with Glenn McGrath, Jason Gillespie, Damien Fleming and Lee.
