

Chittagong & Cox's Bazar districts Use of sanitary toilets up by 130 pc in 5 yrs

UNB, Dhaka

A workshop yesterday said hygiene and sanitation coverage had remarkably improved in some areas of Chittagong and Cox's Bazar districts.

Use of all types of hygiene toilets including pit and water seal have increased by 130 per cent while that of hang/open household toilets decreased by an average of 62 per cent in last five years.

Moreover, prevalence rates of diarrhoea in under five children have dramatically dropped by 70 per cent on average – from 29.3 per cent in 1996 to 8.7 per cent in 2000.

The findings were presented at a workshop on "Sanitation and Family Education Resource (SAFER)" project, organised by CARE-Bangladesh.

SAFER, a five-year project of CARE beginning in 1996, is providing hygiene behaviour change service to a population of 139,000 at 148 villages at 26 unions in

seven thanas of Chittagong and Cox's Bazar districts.

The project is being jointly implemented by CARE and six partner NGOs (PNGO) at Mirercharai, Sitakundo, Boukhali of Chittagong and Cox's Bazar Sadar, Chokoria, Ramu and Ukhia of Cox's Bazar district.

CARE country director Steve Wallace, Dr M A Sabur coordinator health and population sector CARE, Dr Ziaur Rahman project coordinator SAFER among others spoke at the workshop. Consultants of Evaluation of SAFER Mohammad Rokonuddin and Dr Suzanne Hanchett presented the final evaluation report.
