'A BCCI ploy'

India's threat to boycott the World Cup was an attempt to get the ICC to intervene following the country's refusal to play Pakistan, an Indian cricket official said on Thursday.

The Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) said on Tuesday it would boycott major events such as the World Cup and the ICC Knockout tournament until the government clarified its guidelines over which teams it was allowed to play.

The boycott threat came after the BCCI received a government letter saying the team was not to play at "non-regular" venues such as Sharjah and Singapore for the next three years.

"We want the International Cricket Council to intervene on the Pakistan problem," the official, who did not want to be identified,

told this news agency. "It (the threat) is a deliberate attempt on our part to shock the ICC. Nobody would contemplate not playing in the World Cup. We can send the guidelines to the ICC and they can't remain silent ob-

Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) has engaged Australian expert Daryl Foster as bowling coach and consultant for the England tour till a decision on the team's main coach



is finalised, board officials said Thursday.

Pakistan's search for the team's main coach is still on with South African-based Englishman Richard Pybus tipped , as top contender, they said.

"Mr Foster has agreed to join the Pakistan team for the two Tests on the tour of England in May and we may extend his tenure for the one-day series as well, PCB director of operations Brigadier Munawwar Rana told this news agency.

"We are still negotiating with some people and may name the main coach in the next few days," he added.

Foster becomes the second foreign coach to be linked with Pakistan after Pybus remained associated with the team as trainer-cum-coach in 1999 before being sacked.

Pakistan dumped coach Javed Miandad after the tour of New Zealand earlier this month.

"Foster's utility will be more as he has recently worked with our fast bowler Shoaib Akhtar in Australia," Rana said.

Akhtar, cleared from a suspect bowling action, has played a key role in convincing Foster to join the team after he declined an initial offer earlier this month.

Rana refused to disclose the financial details of the deal saying: "This is confidential between u and Foster.'
