

'Bangla has the quality to become UN language'

UNB, Dhaka

President Shahabuddin Ahmed has underscored the need for creating public opinion across the world to establish Bangla as one of the official languages of the United Nations.

"In view of quality and standard, Bengali language carries capability of taking position alongside the current six official languages of the United Nations," he said.

The president said this when a five-member delegation of Biswa Bangla Bhasha Parishad led by its Convenor, language movement veteran Abdul Matin, called on him at Bangabhaban yesterday.

Abdul Matin apprised the president that some people, who were directly involved in the struggle for independence, democracy, education, culture and economic rights, have formed the Biswa Bangla Bhasha Parishad aiming at establishing Bengali language as one of the official languages of the United Nations.

Meanwhile, the council has sent a memorandum to the UN secretary general, the delegation told the

Budget proposal for JS Sectt likely to be approved today

The Sangsad Commission, the highest decision-making body of the Jatiya Sangsad, sits today to discuss issues related to the parliament secretariat.

The meeting, scheduled at 4 in the afternoon, is expected to approve next-year's budget proposal for the Jatiya Sangsad secretariat, parliament sources said.

This time, the parliament secretariat has prepared a draft proposal seeking nearly Tk 35 crore to meet the parliament's expenditure in the next year, which is six per cent less than the previous year's allocation.

In line with the Parliament Secretariat Law 1994, Speaker Humayun Rasheed Chowdhury will preside over the meeting.

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, Finance Minister S A M S Kibria, Law, Justice and Parliamentary Affairs Minister Abdul Matin Khasru are expected to attend the meeting, the sources said.

The Sangsad Commission meeting usually takes place once a year.

Shamsur Rahman Murder Case

5 newsmen among 16 chargesheeted

Sixteen people, including five journalists have been chargesheeted in the sensational Shamsur Rahman Murder Case.

Dulaluddin Akand, ASP of CID, submitted the change sheet to Jessore Sadar Court yesterday.

The chargesheeted journalists are Fakir Shawkat, Benzin Khan, Nova Khandaker, Mizanur Rahman Tota and Milon. Mizanur Rahman Tota is the Bureau Chief of Dinik Inquilab at Jessore.

Eleven other accused are KCC ward commissioner Asaduzzaman Litu and his chief security guard Mushfequr Rahman Hirok, Pagla Selim, Kacchar Selim, Anowarul, Jahangir Hossain, Shukur, Mizanur Rahman of Talbaria, Zahir Badsha, Russel and Nasiruddin Kalu.

Kalu is a top ranking leader of Kotchandpur Awami League as learnt from the charge sheet which has also named 32 persons as prosecution witnesses.

Eight out of the 16 accused are still at large. Of the arrested, four earlier made judicial confession to a first

DU student gunned down in front of his wife

A Dhaka University student was gunned down at his Shewrapara residence in the city yesterday by a gang of armed miscreants.

Mohammed Zayed Akbar Chowdhury, a sophomore of the Department Zoology, was shot point blank on the head, chest and throat in front of his wife, Nusrat Eva.

Quoting relatives of the victim, son of Shafiqul Akbar Chowdhury, police said that a gang led by one Masum went to Shewrapara in a yellow taxicab. They left the cab waiting on the main road and went up to the third floor of the five-storey building at Shewrapara, where Zayed and Eva lived, at around

11:00am.

They pressed the calling bell and asked for Zayed, who was sleeping then. As Zayed woke up at the noise and came to the main door, Masum shot him. While Zayed lay in a pool of blood, the assailants fled the area after firing a few blanks.

Zayed, who used to do modelling, and Eva got married last July. Before marriage, Eva, a student of Eden University College, used to stay at her maternal aunt's at Shahjahanpur.

Masum, who would regularly teased Eva, once held her hostage for several days and released her only after she had signed a paper.

After the incident, Eva went to Cox's Bazar and got married to

Zayed. A few months back, they came back to the capital and started living at the Shewrapara apartment.

When Masum came to know about this, he started teasing Eva again and threatened to kill Zayed on several occasions.

Chittagong-7 Nurul Alam may get BNP ticket in place of SQ Chowdhury

BNP has selected an alternative candidate to contest the upcoming polls in Chittagong-7 constituency in place of its axed leader Salahuddin Qader Chowdhury.

Nurul Alam will replace SQ Chowdhury, who was elected from Chittagong-7 (Rangunia) on BNP ticket in 1996.

On May 10, SQ Chowdhury and Anwar Zahid were expelled from the party on charge of acting against its interest.

BNP sources said the party chairperson has asked Nurul Alam and other local leaders of Rangunia to meet her today at her Banani office to discuss the local situation and effect of SQ Chowdhury's expulsion.

They said the local BNP has welcomed the expulsion of SQ Chowdhury and expressed optimism about defeating the expelled leader in the polls.

The sources said Khaleda Zia may give Nurul Alam a go-ahead to represent BNP in the Chittagong-7 constituency.

BNP-FFs grand rally uncertain

A planned grand rally of the Freedom Fighters Coordination Council may not be held before the general election.

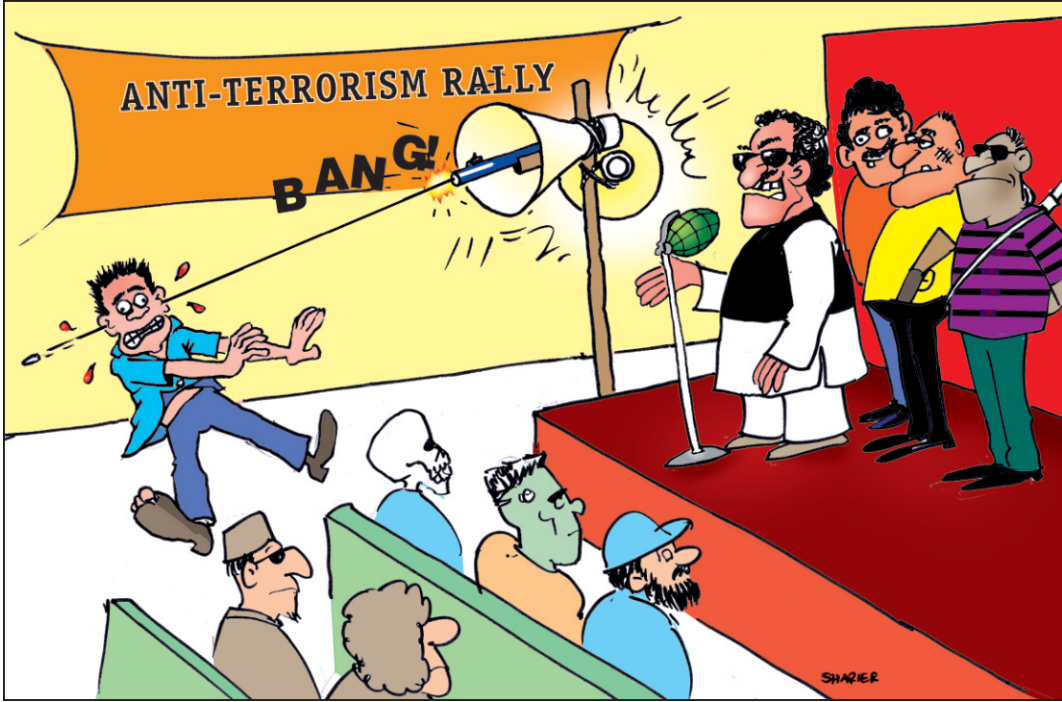
Sources close to the organisers said the wrangling within BNP forced party Chairperson Khaleda Zia to rethink about attending the rally at this stage of national politics.

BNP sources said Khaleda was "psychologically" ready to attend the grand rally, but Colonel (Retd) Oli Ahmed Bir Bikram vehemently opposed her decision to stand beside the freedom fighters who are reportedly not directly affiliated with any political party.

City BNP President Sadeq Hossain Khoka, one of the senior freedom fighters present in the meeting that decided Khaleda's support to the rally, said the rally had been put off due to political preoccupation of his party chief.

The BNP leader would not explain why Khaleda backed out from the rally planned for May 24 at

AL fronts at the forefront

The party, which has been most vocal against terrorism and has introduced the Public Safety Act (PSA) to uproot it, ironically provides protection for criminals in Chittagong. According to police, underworld leaders and local people, terrorists of the Bangladesh Chhatra League and the Jubo League, student and youth organisations respectively of the ruling Awami League, have unleashed a reign of terror in the port city. They operate from different colleges and educational institutions and possess a huge bulk of illegal arms.

However, conflict of interest has led to splits and there are now four groups dominating the port city and adjoining areas. Except for one, each group is loyal to one ruling



party leader or the other.

Ward Commissioner Mamunur Rashid, who has recently surrendered to after having barged into the office of a news daily with his men and beating up two of its staff, leads one of these groups. The group is said to be loyal to ABM Mohiuddin Chowdhury, an allegation the Chittagong Mayor vehemently opposes.

"I have never ever protected or patronised any terrorist," he told The Daily Star. "It is true that some political leaders do nurture terrorists in their parties. I am not one of them."

The mayor himself took the initiative to have Mamun surrender to police in the face of strong protest

from the journalists' community.

Industrialist Akhtaruzzaman Chowdhury Babu is learnt to have the allegiance of a terrorist group, and so is AJM Nasir. The fourth group of BCL-Jubo League terrorists is not loyal to anyone in particular.

Mamun's group, which operates from the city's Omar Gani MES College area, now marshalled by Sunil Dey, Mahim and some other notorious criminals in the Jubo League leader's absence. With Mamun detained, conflict within the group is feared on the issue of

From criminal to kingmaker

Infamous terrorist, Jubo League leader and Ward Commissioner of Chittagong City Corporation Mamunur Rashid Mamun, who surrendered recently, became a millionaire by extorting money, according to his former associates.

His crime exploits earned him the label of a 'political leader' and he has always basked in the blessing of ministers of the ruling party and an influential quarter.

Mamun settled long ago in Chittagong along with his father Abdul Mannan and other members of the family from Senbagh area of Noakhali district. Mannan used to earn a living by selling milk or pushing carts, the
