

# Over 3382 schools, colleges to be equipped with computers

The government will equip 3,382 schools and colleges with computers in the next academic year.

Under five government projects to introduce computer courses at the secondary and higher secondary education, 10,388 computers will be given to these institutions in the first phase, official sources said.

The Cabinet Purchase Committee approved on Thursday the procurement proposal for personal computers (PCs).

"We hope to install computers at the institutions selected on the first stage within two or three months from now on, provided the government departments concerned cooperate with us," said Shamsul Alam of Byte Communications Sweden B.V, a partner of Tulip Computers International.

The Netherlands will share half the estimated cost of Tk 45.45 crore under an agreement between Bangladesh and the Netherlands.

Bangladesh sought the Dutch grant in mid-2000 with a view to bringing computer education at the grassroots level.

Under this programme, the Dutch computer company would also provide special training to 6,764 school teachers at NOTRAMS Bogra.

Earlier, the government lifted duty on computer imports to promote IT education and create IT-related job market in the country. Every year nearly 1,00,000 students would benefit from the courses, education ministry sources said.

About five years ago, the ministry took up five projects for introducing computer courses at schools and colleges, both in government and private sectors, with an estimated cost of Tk 125 crore. But, no school or college has so far received any computer despite the fact that Tk 25 crore had already been spent.

## Criminal case Charges framed against four policemen

The Second Additional Chief Metropolitan Magistrate's Court, Dhaka framed charges against four policemen on Sunday in a criminal case.

The accused are Sub-Inspector Mohammad Khorshed Alam, Assistant Sub-Inspector Abdul Hakim, and constables Amir Hossain and Abdul Karim-of Mohammadpur thana in the city.

The ACMM, Muhammad Shafiqul Azim Khan Siddiqui, fixed August 20 for trial.

The accused pleaded not guilty and demanded justice before the court after hearing the charges against them.

The accused took away Sheikh Mohammad Harun a fax-phone trader from the Tajmahal Road in the city, snatched Tk 10,000 and tortured him mercilessly at about 10 am on April 24 in 1999 for which he was in coma for eleven days.

Victim's brother filed a petition case with the CMM's court, Dhaka against them the same month.

Advocate Syed Rezaur Rahman appeared for the accused while Advocates Khondaker Abdul Mannan, Mohammad Abdul Mannan Khan of Bangladesh Legal Aid and Services Trust (BLAST) for the complainant.

All the accused were present in the court during the hearing.

## Trader shot dead in Sylhet

A young trader was shot dead by miscreants at Kuarpur area of the town yesterday afternoon.

Agun was found near his body.

Police and local people said the assailants called Delwar, 20, out of his house at 94 Kuarpur at about 5 pm, when he went to have lunch from his grocery shop.

Delwar is son of one Lilu Miah. The miscreants took him to a nearby pond side and fired in his chest. He died on the spot.

A case was filed with the Kotwali police.

The body was sent to the Sylhet MAG Osmari Medical College for autopsy.

The cause behind the killing could not be known immediately.

# Produce quality fabrics to face world market: PM

## TexBangla exhibition begins in city

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday asked private entrepreneurs to prepare adequately, especially with increased fabric production, to face imminent competition in the world apparel market.

"Public and private sectors will have to make united contribution so that the textile industry can meet its requirements from local products; we will have to face the challenges of an open competition," she said referring to the post-MFA (Multi-Fibre Agreement) era that is in the offing.

Inaugurating the TexBangla textile exhibition at Hotel Sheraton yesterday morning, the prime minister said there would be a free competition when the multi-fibre agreement will expire after 2004 abolishing privileged market access for the poorer countries to the developed world through quota system.

Attaching importance to setting up more backward-linkage industries, she said the government would

continue its total support, cooperation and assistance for every initiative of attaining self-sufficiency in textiles and making apparel export vibrant and dynamic.

In this regard, Hasina hoped that BTMA (Bangladesh Textile Mills Association), the organiser of the textile show, would take pragmatic plans to establish mills to produce quality yarn and fabric for fulfilling people's demand and helping government efforts to attain self-sufficiency in textiles.

She pointed out that apart from the world market, there is also a big domestic market of 12 crore people for the textile industry.

Finance Minister Shah AMS Kibria, Industries Minister Tofail Ahmed, Commerce Minister Abdul Jalil, State Minister for Textiles AKM Jahangir Hossain and BTMA Chairman Salman F Rahman also addressed the inaugural function.

## 15 'Taliban activists' arrested in Khulna

Police yesterday arrested 15 madrasah students from Balurmath area of Labonchora under Khulna thana.

All the 15 young men are being suspected as Taliban activists.

The place from where they were arrested is half-a-mile away from the spot where Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina will lay foundation of Rupsha Bridge on May 30.

Police seized their luggages. They hailed from Jessore, Jhenidah and Patuakhali districts. When asked, the madrasah students said they were bound for an excursion trip to the Sundarbans. But police do not believe this as some evidences were recovered from their possession. Those include army uniforms, booklets on Taliban ideology and poems on Taliban activities.

The arrested are aged between 16 and 20. Police are continuing hunt for their leader who managed to escape during the raid. All the 15 were arrested from a trowler, police said.

Acting on a tip-off, Khulna thana OC Kamrul Islam along with some sub-inspectors raided the trowler at Labonchora early in the morning.

Sources said the 15 young men were recently enrolled as 'Taliban comandos'. They were bound for the Sundarbans for a training course.

Police arrested them under Section 54 and all of them have been

### Super high- yielding rice

The Bangladesh Rice Research Institute (BRRI) has developed a 'Super High Yielding Variety (S-HYV)' of rice with a growth potential of 12 to 14 metric tons per hectare, BRRI Director General Dr Nurul Islam Bhuiyan announced yesterday. He said the new variety, developed through hybridisation of a HYV with a foreign variety, would be in the hands of farmers after two to three seasons of field trials. This thick and sturdy Super HYV has no lodging problem and each panicle holds more grains than any HYV.

## 2164 arrested on second day of special drive

Police arrested 2164 people including 18 listed terrorists on the second day of month-long countrywide special drive yesterday.

Police also recovered 53 firearms and 251 bullets from across the country during the operation yesterday.

Over 2000 people including some listed criminals were arrested on the first day of the drive on Sunday.

Police started the month-long operation to arrest criminals in a bid to restore law and order across the country.

Our Magura correspondent said 56 people including four listed criminals were arrested from the district on the second day.

## BDR-BSF flag meet at Tetulia today

A sector commander level flag meeting between Bangladesh Rifles (BDR) and Indian Border Security Force (BSF) will be held today at Tetulia of the district, BDR sources said.

BDR Rangpur sector has arranged all preparations to hold the meeting.

The two sides will discuss, withdrawal of soldiers deployed in the bordering areas, easing complexities created following construction of a groin in the Mohananda river and keeping open the "Tin Bigha Corridor" for 24 hours for the movement of the people of the Chhitmahal.

BDR Rangpur sector commander Colonel Ferdous Ahmed Khan and DIG of Shiliguri sector of BSF Ajit Shing will lead their respective sides in the meeting, sources said.

The officials of BDR and BSF will also attend the meeting. The meeting will discuss the ways to ease tension in the bordering areas, stop smuggling, drug and women trafficking.

Colonel Ferdous Ahmed and the adjutant of 22 battalion in Rangpur, Lieutenant Colonel Abdul Quader, will receive the 13-member BSF delegation at the 772 main pillar in Banglabandha frontier at 10 am today.

## National Library policy approved

The Cabinet yesterday approved the National Library Policy at its regular meeting with Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina in the chair.

The cabinet also okayed the proposal to amend the Buddhist Religious Welfare Trust Ordinance, 1983.

It approved the proposal for formation of Ashuganj Power Company Ltd under the Company Act for corporatisation of Ashuganj Power Generation Centre being run by the Bangladesh Power Development Board.

Besides, the meeting approved some recommendations of Public Administration Reform Commission (PARC) regarding driving license, vehicle registration, fitness and simple road tax payment system.

## 5 dacoits held with arms after gunfight in Ctg

Detective Branch (DB) of police arrested five dacoits with eight firearms after a 45 minute gunfight from Char Rangamatiya area on the northern bank of the Kamaphuli river under Chandgaon thana on Sunday night.

The arrested were identified as Abdul Mannan, 30; Nazrul Islam, 35; Md Ibrahim, 32, Md Ali 32 and Jahangir Alam, 35.

Police also recovered guns, 3-LG, 1-pipegun and 16 cartridges from their possession.

Acting on a tip-off, a DB team led by Sub Inspector AKM Mohiuddin took position in disguise there hours before the operation. At about 10 pm, a gang of 12 dacoits arrived at the place in an engine boat and started preparing for a dacoity.

At this stage, police cordoned the place and the dacoits started firing. Police returned the fire. After exchange of over 100 rounds, police caught five dacoits while the others escaped in their boat.

Police yesterday produced the arrested dacoits in court and prayed for a seven-day remand.

During the gunfight, SI Mohiuddin was slightly injured, police said.

Two cases were filed by police with Chandgaon thana in this connection.

## Woman's body recovered

The body of an unidentified woman was recovered from behind the Sultana Kamal Women's Sports Complex in city's Dhanmondi in the early hours of yesterday.

The woman, aged about 20, was wearing shalwar-kameez. The victim had marks of injury in her throat and is believed to have been strangled by miscreants, police said.

Police sent the body to Dhaka Medical College Hospital morgue for autopsy.

Dhanmondi police filed an unnatural death case in this regard.

# Ctg port workers' ultimatum to govt

Leaders of 22 workers' associations, including ruling party-backed Collective Bargaining Agent (CBA), of Chittagong Port threatened to launch a tough action programme from next month if their six-point demands is not met by Thursday.

The presidents and general secretaries of six workers' associations backed by the ruling party and the opposition, and CBA in a joint statement issued the ultimatum Sunday night, and asked the Secretary of Shipping Ministry to meet their demands by the deadline.

Their demands include introduction of incentive bonus, exempting the port from corporate tax, exemption of the provision of corporate tax in the proposed 2001-2002 budget and special reserve of 20 per cent foreign currency earned by the port for its own revenue expenditure like Biman.

Other demands are: import of machinery for operational activities of port without VAT, income tax, customs and import duties, and filling of the vacant posts of the port under revenue budget immediately.

A competent source of the port authorities said a tripartite meeting of workers' associations, the port authorities and the shipping secretary decided that the government would exempt the port from corporate tax. But the government took Tk 5 crore on May 3 and over Tk 13.79 crore on May 17 from the fund of the port.

On the other hand, port officials said the money was given to the government following a decision of a meeting held on April 10 with Finance Minister Shah AMS Kibria in the chair.

## Special security for PM, her family

# Opposition vows to resist move to formulate law

Opposition leaders yesterday vowed to resist the move to formulate a new law on special security measures for Sheikh Hasina and her family members after her resignation.

The leaders said the prime minister is now afraid of her future as she and her party resorted to unprecedented repression on people and opposition activists, looted people's wealth, killed thousands of people, and committed all sorts of illegal activities in last five years.

Addressing a big rally at Muktangan, organised by the BNP-led opposition alliance, the leaders alleged that the AL government hatched conspiracy to pass a 'black law' to stay in power permanently and to make an election hoax.

They said the people of the country under the AL rule are completely insecure; and killing, mugging, hijacking and looting are looming large. But the prime minister forgetful of the security of others is trying to introduce a new law for security of herself and other family members, they said.

Opposition leaders said the late President Sheikh

Mujibur Rahman introduced Special Powers Act, Rakkhi Bahini and BKSAL, but all the measures to stay in power proved futile.

So, they said no law would be able to protect Sheikh Hasina from people's wrath as soon as she steps down from power. They said the new law would jeopardise the democratic process and introduce monarchism of some sort in Bangladesh.

Speaking at the rally, BNP Secretary General Abdul Mannan Bhuiyan asked the government to refrain from making such 'anti-people' law and assured that BNP would provide adequate security measures for Sheikh Hasina if voted to power.

"We will request President Shahabuddin Ahmed to provide adequate security measures for Sheikh Hasina during the caretaker government although the present government had taken away security of the former Prime Minister Khaleda Zia," he said.

He reminded that the AL government all on a sudden withdrew security team from Khaleda Zia's convoy

## Hearing of Jail Killing Case

# Everything was done at gunpoint: Nuruzzaman

M Nuruzzaman, third prosecution witness in the Jail Killing Case, was cross-examined by defence lawyers for the second day yesterday in the Special Court adjacent to Dhaka Central Jail.

Judge Ahmed Jamil Mostafa adjourned the hearing till this morning. Cross-examination of Nuruzzaman will resume at 9.30 am.

Four national leaders Syed Nazrul Islam, Tajuddin Ahmed, Captain Mansur Ali and AHM Quamruzzaman where murdered in the Dhaka Central Jail on November 3, 1975.

During the four and a half-hour cross-examination, Nuruzzaman said all necessary arrangements for boarding, feeding of the detained people in the jail are responsibility of the jail authorities. He told the court that the Jail authorities are also responsible for ensuring security to all inside the jail including the detainees.

Nuruzzaman told the court that he never talked to Major Rashid and Khandaker Mushtaque before the jail killing. He said he also did not meet Captain Moslehuddin before.

The prosecution witness said all the doors of the rooms where the four national leaders were confined were under lock and key on the night of the incident. Moslem along with four armed men forced the on-duty jail guards to open the gate of the jail. They (guards) were helpless as it was done at gunpoint, he said.

Nuruzzaman told the court that he later talked to Major Rashid over telephone. Besides going to the Bangabhaban to talk to Brig Khaled Mosharraf all necessary steps were taken to save the national leaders from
