

'Govt has taken every possible step to improve health services'

UNB, *Khulna*

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday said her government is trying relentlessly to reach healthcare facilities to the doorsteps of common people because that is their basic right.

The present government has taken every possible step to improve the standard of health services and constructed 18,000 community health clinics across the country and works on 10,000 more are underway and will be completed by next month," she said while inaugurating a new building of Khulna Medical College Hospital.

She also said the Awami League government had undertaken nutrition project for the poor, Integrated Nutrition Project for mother and child and introduced Emergency Service Package (ESP) for reducing maternal and child mortality rates.

Referring to massive programmes taken in population sector, Hasina said now the population growth rate reduced to 1.5 per cent while the rate of contraceptive prevalence rose to 54 per cent, average life expectancy rose to 61 years, child mortality rate reduced to 67 per cent 1,000 and maternal death 3 per cent.

World Tobacco Free Day today

World Tobacco Free Day will be observed in the country as elsewhere across the globe today, report agencies.

On the occasion President Shahabuddin Ahmed has underlined the need for sincere efforts of all to lead a healthy life, build a pollution-free environment and protect the society from bad effects of tobacco.

"Widespread use of tobacco poses a threat to public health, environment and the economy," he said in a message on the eve of World Tobacco Free Day.

He appreciated this year's theme for the day, "Tobacco smoke causes death to non-smokers too: Let's build a tobacco-free environment."

President Shahabuddin Ahmed

wished overall success of the day.

In a separate message Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina has urged all to launch a social movement against the use of tobacco and tobacco goods.

Medical researches have proved that tobacco smoke is equally harmful to non-smokers and sometimes it may be the cause of death. So, it is essential to keep workplaces, vehicles and places of public gathering free from smoking," she said in her message on the occasion of World Tobacco Free Day.

The Prime Minister said the harmful effect of smoking on public health protection and overall development is widespread and far-reaching.

In recent years, Hasina said, there has been a trend among youths of becoming addicts to tobacco, tobacco goods and other drugs. "And this has been a barrier to building a healthy and able nation."

The Prime Minister sought support and participation of all in implementing the objectives of this year's theme.

Confce on fundamentalism begins tomorrow

With an aim to form a common regional platform to fight the growing religious fundamentalism, members of the South Asian civil societies have begun assembling in Dhaka.

They will attend a two-day regional conference on fundamentalism and communalism and the role of civil society, beginning from tomorrow. The inaugural session will take place at Osmani Memorial Auditorium at 10 am tomorrow.

Writers, poets, human rights activists, academicians, journalists, political leaders, women activists, trade union activists, lawyers and diplomats from Bangladesh, India, Pakistan, Sri Lanka and Nepal will exchange views in the conference.

Members of the national organising committee of the conference at a press conference yesterday described the necessity and objectives of the conference.

Writer Sharir Kabir from Bangladesh, human rights activists Shahid Fiaz from Pakistan, journalist Yubi Nath Lamsal from Nepal and journalist Sathiv Balakrishnan from Sri Lanka spoke on the occasion at the National Press Club.

They observed that the religious fundamentalist forces have shown strong resilience and are continuing to operate.

"If the influence of such fundamentalism is allowed to grow in the subcontinent and if the fun-

damentalist forces take over the state power then the democratic values would be totally destroyed as it happened in Afghanistan," said Sharir Kabir.

In the volatile context of South Asian region, Kabir emphasised for strengthening the role of the civil societies in this region and form a regional forum to protect peace, democracy, freedom and basic human rights.

The regional conference will deal with the role of the governments, political parties, civil societies in fighting fundamentalism and communalism in its eight working sessions.
