



The world's oldest continuously sanctioned sporting competition is the Kirkpinar Wrestling Festival, Turkey, which has been held since 1460. The event is staged on the Sarayici Peninsula, near Edirne. The Arkpinar Festival is staged to commemorate the sacrifice of 40 Ottoman soldiers, who wrestled to their deaths in an open field in Rumeli, Turkey. Wrestling champions compete in an open field with bouts lasting as long as 40 minutes. The wrestlers wear nothing but leather "trousers" and their upper torsos are coated in olive oil. The winner is awarded the Golden Belt and the title "Basphelivan", presented by the President of Turkey.

The touring team seized England's last eight wickets for 75. including the last five batsmen for nine in 34 balls, to snatch a first innings lead of 46 at tea on the third day at Old Trafford.
