

President may address the nation soon

President Shahabuddin Ahmed is expected to address the nation soon over state-run television and radio.

With the parliamentary election only a week away, the president is learnt to have decided to make a public appearance to assure the nation of a free and fair election on time, sources said.

The president is consulting with his aides about the draft of his proposed speech.

"The speech of the president will instil the much-required confidence in the people to create a much-desired congenial, pre-polling atmosphere," said a ranking official.

During the tenure of the caretaker government, Chief Advisor Latifur Rahman addressed the nation twice and the chief election commissioner once.

It is likely that both will appear on the national electronic media once again prior to the October 1 polls.

Businessman stabbed to death in city

Muggers stabbed to death a businessman and took away Tk 3.5 lakh from him in the city last night.

The incident occurred in front of Ispahani Bhaban in Motijheel area, hospital sources said.

A gang of three waylaid Abul Hossain, 35, and asked him to give what he had with him. On his refusal, they stabbed him and took away the money.

Fatally injured, Abul Hossain was rushed to the Chest Disease Hospital where the doctors declared him dead.

Motijheel police said none went to the police station to file any case.

WTC attack Bangladeshi at NY hospital

A Bangladeshi admitted to Staten Island Hospital in New York with severe burn injuries in the attack on the World Trade Centre is yet to be contacted by his relatives and friends.

The hospital authorities have identified him as Tushar, his first name.

Tushar was shifted to the hospital on the day of the incident, an e-mail message received here yesterday from New York said.

Tushar is in the intensive care unit (ICU) now. The e-mail said nobody contacted the hospital asking for him till now. Anyone knowing a person with this first name who is missing in the US has been requested to contact the hospital immediately.

Dacoity at ex-minister's house

An armed gang looted about TK 30 lakh in cash, gold ornaments and other valuables from the residence of a former state minister in Sangsad Bhban area in the early hours of yesterday, police said.

The gang entered the bedroom of Dr Saida Amanullah, wife of former state minister for health Dr Amanullah, on the first floor of the house.

They tied up members of the family, took away key of the almirah and looted Tk 13 lakh, 130 tolas of gold ornaments and other valuables.

Dr Amanullah was in his constituency - Valuka- for election campaign.

On information, he came back and filed a case with Tejagaon thana in this regard.

Transport strike in Barisal

Khaleda is biased to India as she was born there

Hasina tells Rupganj rally

Awami League President Sheikh Hasina has accused her arch rival BNP chief Khaleda Zia of lying on different national issues.

"Telling lies is both her addiction and profession," Hasina said referring to Khaleda's recent allegation that the AL government had failed to protect Bangladesh's borders with India.

Addressing a huge election rally at Rupganj in Narayanganj yesterday, the AL leader said the BNP chief had claimed that Bangladesh would become part of India after signing of the CHT peace agreement and the Ganges water-sharing agreement.

"Had it be so, she (Khaleda) would have contested for a Lok Sabha (Indian parliament) seat.

"In fact, she (Khaleda) is always biased to India due to the fact that she was born in Shiliguri of India ... She dreams of India every now and then, but her dream will never come true," Hasina said. "We were born in Bangladesh and our roots are very much here in Bangladesh."

The immediate-past prime minister accused her predecessor Khaleda Zia of surrendering the country's interests to India by signing an accord enabling India to push its nationals into Bangladesh. Furthermore, the Khaleda government made the country a market of Indian goods by reducing import taxes from 300-400 per cent to 30-40 per cent.

"Those who do not believe in the concept of Bangladesh and those who committed genocide during the nation's struggle for independence will find no place on the soil of the country," she told the cheering crowd, urging them not to allow razakars to come to power.

Referring to Khaleda's promise of a Bangladesh free of corruption and terrorism, Hasina wondered how she would do so because she and others in her cabinet were accused in corruption cases and she patronised terrorists in her party.

"She (Khaleda) even resorted to falsehood regarding her date of birth ... She does not have any accurate date

Pre-election clashes leave 174 injured

Pre-election clashes involving activists of rival political parties left at least 174 injured in different parts of the country yesterday and the day before.

Of them, 30 people were injured in Sirajganj, 9 in Chittagong, 5 in Gaibandha, 11 in Narsingdi, 20 in Bhola, 25 in Shariatpur, five in Madaripur, and 24 in Munshiganj.

Our Sirajganj correspondent reports: At least 30 people were injured in a series of clashes between the supporters of Awami League and BNP yesterday.

The clash erupted when a motorcade of BNP candidate Iqbal Hasan Tuku came under attack allegedly by AL activists in Shangacha area under Sadar upazila in the afternoon.

Witnesses said rivals attacked Tuku's motorcade while he was returning to Sirajganj after election campaign at Aminpur. They also

clashed with police, leaving six persons including two policemen injured.

Police rescued Iqbal Hasan and brought him to Sirajganj town. Later, activists of four-party alliance brought out a procession in the town and attacked the main election office of AL candidate Mohammad Nasim at SS Road.

They also clashed with AL workers and damaged a number of shops. Police charged batons to bring the situation under control. At least 19 persons were injured during the clash between the supporters of two rival parties.

In retaliation, the AL activists attacked the BNP candidate's main election office at Fazlul Haq road in the town, injuring two BNP workers.

Iqbal Hasan Tuku at a press conference in the evening alleged that his 20 election offices in Shangacha area were damaged by the workers of rival candidate.

A tense situation is prevailing in the town. Police, BDR and Army personnel are patrolling the streets in the town.

Tuku filed a case with Sadar thana accusing 25 persons.

The district Awami League leaders, however, denied the allegation.

Our Correspondent from Chittagong writes: At least five persons were injured in a clash between the activists of Awami League and BNP at Chandanaish in the district Friday evening.

Section 144 has been imposed in Dohazari area under the thana for 24 hours from 2 pm yesterday (Saturday) as both the parties called protest rallies at the same venue at the same time.

Sources said, the trouble erupted when a protest rally of local unit of Awami League at Satbaria came under attack, reportedly by BNP activists, in the afternoon. AL was

They said some local intellectuals, educationists and social workers have taken the initiative to build the university at Trishal after the name of the national Poet Kazi Nazrul Islam.

Alleged mugger beaten to death in city

An alleged mugger was beaten to death by local people in Goalnagar area in old city on Friday night.

Police and hospital sources said one Chan Miah, 29, was caught by people in the area at about 11 pm when he along with his accomplices was reportedly snatching money and valuables from a passerby.

The locals beat him up and handed over to police. He was admitted to Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) and later shifted to Orthopadic Hospital as his condition deteriorated.

Police said Chan Miah, who claimed himself an employee of a shop at Fulbaria Adarsha Hawkers Market, died at the hospital at about 3 am.

No case was filed in connection with incident.

Empower army to arrest terrorists, recover arms

Khaleda demands at Bogra rally

BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia said yesterday army should be empowered to arrest terrorists and recover illegal firearms to ensure a free, fair and peaceful general election.

"Deployment of army only is not enough. Rather, they should have been given the authority of arresting criminals and recovering illegal arms to create an atmosphere conducive to holding of the election," she said.

The former prime minister was addressing a mammoth public meeting at Alfatunnesa playground in Bogra town.

She said the environment for a peaceful election has not been created as yet since a large number of illegal arms are still in the hands of the Awami League terrorists. Moreover, the unlicensed arms are yet to be submitted to the authorities. The BNP chief said it was not enough that army deployed to improve law and order would remain inside the camps.

The four-party alliance chief alleged that sensing a debacle in the coming election AL started unleashing

terror across the country, attacking BNP men, killing people and ransacking polling centres. "Election would not be held if such a situation continues," she cautioned.

She also said many AL men are still holding various important posts in the administration. "They should be transferred before the election so that they can't influence the polls."

Tens of thousands people started pouring onto the meeting venue since noon carrying sheaf of paddy and portraits of Khaleda in their hands. The meeting was scheduled for a 3pm start but Khaleda arrived there at 5:30pm.

During the half-an-hour speech in her own constituency (Bogra-6), she said a massive wave has been created in favour of sheaf of paddy and the four-party alliance across the country. She pledged that if voted to power, her party along with its partners in the alliance would root out terrorism and corruption from the country, restore peace for all and ensure fair prices of all agri

Miscreants spray bullets on BNP candidate's car

Unidentified miscreants sprayed bullets on two vehicles of BNP candidate from Dhaka- 9 constituency Khandaker Mahbub Uddin Ahmed yesterday, police said.

The incident occurred when Mahbub and his supporters were campaigning inside Mohammodi Housing in Mohammadpur area of the city, leaving the vehicles on a road nearby.

Local BNP leaders claimed that their party activist Ratan and Kamal, driver of one of the vehicles, were bullet-hit in the attack. But it could not be known immediately where they were admitted.

They blamed activists of Awami League candidate Mockbul Hossain for the attack.

The vehicles -- one microbus (Dhaka Metro -Bha -02-0313) owned by the BNP candidate and a hired taxicab (Dhaka Metro-Gha-3586) -- were damaged in the attack, they claimed.

On the other hand, local AL leaders claimed that BNP activists ransacked their election camp at Nabodoi Road in the area.

Mohammadpur police said they suspect that the attack on the vehicles was done by some disgruntled

CMCH authorities to open 'fair price medicine shop' this week

Chittagong Medical College and Hospital (CMCH) authorities will open a 'fair price medicine shop' on the hospital premises this week.

Director of CMCH Brig Zillur Rahman told this correspondent that the shop will cater to needs of the patients admitted to the hospital.

All life saving drugs will be available in the shop at cheaper prices, he said.

CMCH is the first government hospital in the country to have such a medicine shop to help patients buy medicine at cheaper price, he mentioned.

All other government hospitals will gradually have similar medicine shops, sources said.

CMCH got government approval for the shop this year after a feasibility study by a committee headed by Prof Dr A Q M Sirajul Islam, head of skin and VD department.

A private drug trader was engaged through tender recently to run the shop. Security money of Tk ten lakh was collected from the trader, who agreed to sell medicine at prices 12 to 15 per cent less than market prices. Besides, he will be required to pay Tk 20,000 every month to the 'patients welfare fund' as a sort of donation, the CMCH director said.

The initiative for a fair price medicine shop was taken as patients at the hospital were forced to buy medicines from pharmacies nearby at exorbitant prices, he said.
