Light to moderate rain or thundershower accompanied by temporary gusty wind is likely at a few places over Chittagong, Barisal, Khulna, Dhaka, Rajshahi and Sylhet divisions in the next 24 hours till 6 pm today.

No notable change in temperature is expected over the country during the period, Met Office said.

Yesterday's highest temperature of 36.0 degree Celsius was recorded at Chittagong, Cox's Bazar and Jessore and the lowest of 24.8 degree at Srimongal and Syedpur.

Development of Mirpur is top priority

AL candidate Kamal Mojumder says

Awami League candidate in Dhaka-11 constituency for the coming general election Kamal Ahmed Mojumder has said that if elected, he would take up massive development programme for Mirpur area, including rehabilitation of slum dwellers.

"I should take up projects for removing the slums and rehabilitate the dwellers in some specially developed areas in Bhasantak. I would seek help from foreign donor agencies and local non-government organisations (NGOs) to make the programme a success," he said while talking to The Daily Star at his election office at Mirpur recently.

Mojumder identified *khals* land and abandoned property as one of the main reasons behind terrorism and toll extortions in Mirpur. If these are not handled carefully and used for the welfare of maximum number of people, it would be very difficult to maintain law and order in the area, he added.

"Over the past five years, I have done various development work in the area. These include construction of roads, upgrading colleges and schools, establishing new educational institutions and setting up water pumps," he said. "Some of the best educational institutions of the city are now in Mirpur area and these have earned reputation for academic performances," he went on.

The AL nominee alleged that his main rival in the polls race BNP candidate SA Khaleque and his son were elected several times in the past, but they did not do

anything for the development of Mirpur. "Khaleque is not a literate person and he does not even know how to raise any issue about his constituency in the parliament. So I do not understand why people would vote for him," he said.

"Before the 1991 and June 1996 elections, it was possible to take control of polling centres using hired goons and cast votes in favour of anyone and Khaleque got elected this way. He did not need votes from genuine voters. But those days have gone. If anyone now expects votes from people of the area, he has to work for them," Mojumder said.

He further said that finding no other alternative, Khaleque may hire armed cadres and create panic among voters this time also. But people will resist any such move and cast their votes peacefully.

Kamal Mojumder contested by-election in the constituency in 1993 for the first time and lost it to Syed Mohsin, son of Khaleque. But he won the June 1996 general election by defeating Fikhsas Molla of BNP. A total of 18 candidates are participating in the electoral race for the seat this time.

He alleged that the BNP nominee spent Tk four crore to get the party ticket this time. "It is his business and he has to recover this investment."

Khaleque's employees who work in his cinema hall and transports are tearing his (Kamal's) posters in violation of the electoral code of conduct, Mojumder alleged.

He claimed that he was the only MP who did not receive any relief from the Prime Minister's relief fund.

Two BCL leaders arrested in Ctg

Two BCL leaders were held in the city in the early hours of yesterday.

Police and Army in a joint pre-dawn raid arrested the listed terrorists -- Suranjit Barua alias Lavi Barua and Rajib Datta alias Rinku -- from Nanondan Kanon area under Kotoali thana at around 3 am.

Barua, a leader Chittagong city unit of BCL, is an accused in nine criminal cases including six murder cases. Rinku is also a listed terrorist and an accused in six murder cases.

Trader beaten up, dies at DMCH

Beheaded body of a boy recovered

A sanitary ware trader who was beaten up by miscreants four days ago died at the DMCH yesterday morning.

In another incident, the beheaded body of a five-year-old boy was recovered from Dhakkin Khan in the city's Uttara area yesterday.

Police also said they are yet to file any case in this connection.

In the other incident, police recovered the beheaded body of Mosharrif Hossain, the adopted son of Firoza Begum and Mohammad Samsed.

Mosharrif had been missing since Tuesday. Local people found his body yesterday morning. However, the head of the boy could not be found.

The reason behind the killing could not be known immediately.

Acting on information, police recovered the body at about 11 am sent it to the Dhaka Medical College (DMCH) for autopsy.

Firoza Begum filed a murder case with Uttara police station, but none was arrested till filing of this report last night.
