## Half of CU voters may not be able to cast votes

Nearly half of the voters in Chittagong University -- 1,426 voters out of total 3,376 -- may not be able to cast their votes in the October 1 general election for the closure of the university.

The university has been closed since die since August 13 following a gunfight between the activists of Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) and Islami Chhatra Shibir (ICS) which left 20 injured.

And the resident students left their respective halls as the authorities asked them to vacate all the nine dormitories following the incident.

The BCL leaders alleged that the Shibir activists may take the advantage of the situation -- they may cast fake votes for their party nominee in Shibir-dominated Chittagong University school & college centres.

## Blast at Shulla Case transferred to CID

The bomb blast case of Shulla upazila has been transferred to the CID, a police official said yesterday.

Meanwhile, the three-member probe committee headed by the Additional District Magistrate of Sunamganj Ruhul Amin will submit its report to the Deputy Commissioner today.

According to the report, posters of 'sheaf of paddy' were found in the room of the dormitory where the blast had taken place. On the other hand, the man who was carrying the bombs was wearing a vest with the images of 'boat' printed on it.

## EC to send own teams to monitor polls

UNB, Dhaka

The Election Commission will send out its own monitoring teams each comprising three deputy secretaries to observe tomorrow's elections in vulnerable areas.

Officials at the EC Secretariat said the Commission has already formed 10 such inspection teams and given them the outline of their mission of observation on EC's behalf.

The members of the monitoring teams who will be representatives in the fields have been given the power of first class magistrates to take necessary action, if required.

"The teams with senior officials were formed in a bid to monitor the election in the field levels on behalf of the Election Commission exclusively," said an official at the EC.

He said the team members will be spread over the country, but their special attention will be at vulnerable areas, marked by the Home Ministry and different intelligence agencies.

The official said the special EC inspection teams will observe the overall situation in the areas during the polling as well as the procedures of voting.

## Air chief visits Rajshahi, Sylhet

## Caretaker admin fails to ensure neutral polls atmosphere: AL

Awami League leaders have ridiculed the caretaker administration and election commission for its failure in taking steps against activists of the BNP-Jamaat clique who have attacked and killed one Awami League activist after another.

Briefing newsmen at its election conducting office at Dhanmondi yesterday afternoon, they alleged that no step was taken to ensure a peaceful election atmosphere despite repeated reminders to the caretaker government and election commission.

Strongly protesting and condemning the killing of six AL men in Fatikchhari by BDR jawans, the AL leaders alleged that instead of taking steps to restore normalcy, BDR personnel had indiscriminately fired gunshots on protesting AL men, killing six of them.

They also alleged the situation had further deteriorated when BDR jawans arrested and confined AL candidate Rafiqul Anwar in their camps and also threatened to kill him.

AL leaders demanded immediate arrest and exemplary punishment of those involved in the killings.

Addressing the briefing, secretary of the AL Election Coordination Committee Mozaffar Hossain Palto said that the anti-liberation

forces led by BNP were killing his party men because they had sense their sure defeat in the election.

Raising question about the neutrality of some election observation organisations including FEMA, he demanded the list and identity of 70,000 observers to whom Asian Foundation had provided accreditation cards.

He asked the caretaker administration to inquire as to why former minister and AL candidate Kalparanjan Chakma had opted to stay away from the election. He said Kalparanjan had failed to play a neutral role.

AL leader Abdul Mannan strongly condemned the killing of Munshiganj town AL president Jalal Ahmed. He alleged that armed cadres of the four-party nominee Abdul Hai shot him dead inside his house.

He also alleged that BTV was giving more coverage to anti-liberation forces than those belonging to various pro-liberation organisations. "BTV broadcast news on Pakistani collaborators and anti-independence Muslim League, but did not telecast news of Muktiyoddha Sangsad and Ekatturer Ghatok Dalal Nirmul Committee.

Among others Syed Ahmad, Monam Sarkar and Ataur Rahman Kaiser were present at the briefing.

## BHRC deploys 32,500 observers during polls

Bangladesh Human Rights Commission (BHRC) is deploying 32,500 observers throughout the country to monitor the October 1 election.

It will also publish on its website at 8pm on election day a special report on election. The website is www.bdhrc.org.

Besides, the BHRC, in a press conference at the BRAC Centre here today, has put forward a set of recommendations to conduct the general election in a free and fair manner.

The suggestions are -- to create an atmosphere favourable to holding election by recovering illegal arms and arresting such arms holders, deploying army in areas where minority groups live to ensure their safety protect their right of franchise.

Other recommendations include taking steps to allow officials and employees of EC, security forces, observers and others involved to exercise their franchise in the concerned polling centres, taking measures to prevent the persons involved in direct politics from monitoring the election and assigning a magistrate of a representative having magistracy power in each polling centre.

The press conference was attended among others by BHRC advisors Amanullah Khan and ASM Badruddoza and Benazir Ahmed RK Chowdhury, M Wazuddin Masum, M Shafiqur Rahman and Adv Billal Hossain of BHRC.

The statement was read out by M Saiful Islam Dildar, general secretary of BHRC on behalf of the commission.

## Robbers loot valuables worth Tk 1.5 lakh

Armed robbers looted money in cash and gold ornaments worth about Tk 1.5 lakh from a residence at Shewrapara in the city's Mirpur area early yesterday morning.

The gang of seven entered into the third floor residence of businessman Sajedul Alam after cutting down window grills at about 4 am yesterday.

They confined the family members into a room and took away the keys of the wardrobe and looted Tk 62,000 in cash and 15 tolas of gold ornaments.

The businessman filed a case with Mirpur police station in this regard but none was arrested till last night.

In another incident a rickshaw driver who was on the way to his relative's residence from Chittagong was severely stabbed by a gang yesterday afternoon.

The incident took place when the victim Babul, 32, a rickshaw driver reached Jatrabari from Chittagong. He was on his way to his uncle's house at Uttar Jatrabari in the city.

A gang of muggers stopped him as he reached Baghbari at Uttar Jatrabari. They asked to hand over his valuables to the gang. They stabbed him in the eye and took away Tk. 10,000 from him.

Babul was rushed to the Dhaka Medical College Hospital in a critical state.

## Arms factory unearthed in Ctg: 5 Shibir activists held

Joint forces of Police and Army in a raid unearthed an arms factory and recovered some firearms from a remote hilly area of Sonakia at Satkania in the district in the early hours yesterday.

They also arrested five Shibir activists from the scene, police said. The arrested are Kamaluddin Monir, Shaha Alam, Kashem and Nurul Islam.

Acting on a tip-off the joint forces of police and army cordoned-off the Jabbar Shah hill area adjacent to Azgar Shah mazaar at Sonakia at around 3.00 am and arrested the Shibir activists.

Upon confession of those arrested the joint team unearthed the arms factory and recovered one pistol, three country-made guns and some arms-making materials from there.

## 314 arrested, 22 firearms seized

Police seized 22 firearms, 36 others types of arms and 37 bullets on the 74<sup>th</sup> day of their countrywide combing operation, official sources said yesterday.

Police also arrested 814 persons including 10 listed terrorists from across the country during the last 24 hours ended at 6 am.

Of the arrested, 358 are already wanted by the police and the other 422 are accused in cases

under investigation.

The identified terrorists arrested by the combined force are -- Mohammed Wasim of Patuakhali, Mizanur Rahman alias Major of Maherpur, Mohabat Hossain alias Kupan of Rajbari, Mohammed Jasimuddin of Bhola, Hafez Mohammed Sakur and Fazlul Kabir of Chittagong, Immam of Cox's Bazar, Sohail of Brahmanbaria and Abdul Aziz alias Aizza and Alhaj Abdul Nabi Ladu of Chittagong city.

The law enforcing agencies also seized 25 explosives from across the country of which DMP police recovered four Barisal police recovered other 20 explosives in abandoned state during the time.

Of the seized arms, each three by DMP and Munshiganj police, four by Cox's Bazar police, five by Comilla police and rest seven by other districts of the country during the time.
