Coach Trevor Chappell's plans have been hampered by poor weather since his charges returned from the Asian Test Championship, where they lost to both Pakistan and Sri Lanka inside three days.

The Zimbabweans, who are due to arrive in Dhaka on November 5. will not play a warm-up of any kind and instead begin their tour with the first Test at the Bangabandhu National Stadium on November 8.

The second and final Test begins on November 15 at Chittagong's MA Aziz Stadium, which will also be the venue for the first one-day international. The last two ODIs take place in Dhaka on November 25 and 27.


