Govt sanctions relief for tornado victims

UNB, Dhaka
The government yesterday sanctioned additional relief materials for the tornado victims in five northern districts.

The relief allocated by the Ministry of Relief for the affected people in Nilphamari, Lalmonirhat, Rangpur, Dinajpur and Gaibandha districts includes 100 mts of rice, 3,500 pieces of lungi and saris, 2,200 tons of high-protein biscuit and Tk 8.50 lakh.

Relief Advisor B B Roy Chowdhury directed local administrations to "immediately take necessary steps to alleviate suffering of the people" caused by the storms that swept over the districts on Friday.

Magistrates have already been appointed to properly carry out relief activities in the affected areas.

In addition, a team headed by the director general of the ministry arrived in tornado-hit areas to

assess the loss and oversee the relief operation, said an official handout.

Meanwhile, BNP chairperson Khaleda Zia has expressed deep shock at the loss of lives and huge damage in tornado in Nilphamari, Lalmonirhat and Rangpur districts.

Khaleda asked her party leaders and workers as well as affluent section of people of the three northern districts to come forward in aid of the victims.

Attack on newsmen JU VC urged to take action against JCD activists

Jahangirnagar University Journalists' Association (JUTA) submitted a memorandum to the Vice Chancellor of the university yesterday demanding punishment to the Jatyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) activists who allegedly beat up and ousted JU correspondent of Promoth Alo on Saturday.

In the memorandum, JUTA leaders termed the attack on the correspondent, Chakor Malitha, a threat to the freedom of press. They demanded immediate action against the JCD activists responsible for the attack.

According to campus sources, some JCD activists ransacked

Malitha's room at Shaheed Salam Barkat Hall and asked him to leave the campus.

While Malitha was leaving the campus at around 2.00 pm, the JCD activists allegedly beat him up at the Dairy Farm Gate.

Later, Malitha received medical treatment at a city clinic on Saturday night.

Meanwhile, the JCD activists alleged that Malitha was involved in the attacks on JCD by the BCL.

Earlier in an emergency meeting, the JUTA leaders expressed grave concern over the attack.

JUTA also sent a letter to the JCD leaders asking them to take steps against their activists who were involved in the attack.

UNEAS, EU to monitor re-polling
