tional and domestic observer reports that the elections were peaceful and that they were conducted in accordance with international standards," he said in the letter to CEC MA Sved

Carter noted that the reports ran counter to public statements attributed to Sheikh Hasina and the Awami League of massive rigging, said an FC press release vesterday

"Any complaints should follow normal legal channels of appeal rather than a complete refusal to recognise the election's legitimacy," said Carter, who had visited the country on a pre-election observation mission last August.

He said Hasina's recent yow to boycott parliament ran counter to her August pledge and has the potential not only to destabilise the new parliament but also to unravel the delicate fabric of the Bangladeshi democracy.

"It is imperative, however, that the Awami League accept the results of the election in order to strengthen Bangladesh's democratic institutions in the long term,"

He appreciated the party's mportant leadership role for democracy in Bangladesh, and said that the AL must continue to play that role while in opposition. "This is the essence of democracy.'
