

Discarded national all-rounder Khaled Mahmud leads a 14member Bangladesh A team on a month-long tour of India. The second string national squad, which leaves later this evening, will play four three-day matches and five limited-overs games against different selections from Mumbai, Pune and Baroda

The team also includes three

The tour starts with a three-day match against the Cricket Club of India (CCI) President's Eleven at the Brabourne Stadium on October 16. There will be two limited-overs

matches in between October 19 to 21 before their second three-day game against the Mumbai Colts It starts at the Wankhede Stadium in Mumbai from October 22.

The last limited-overs match in the showbiz capital will be against the Mumbai Cricket Association Eleven also at the Wankhede Stadium on October 25

The team will then travel to Pune

on October 27 and play a three-day and a one-day match against Maharashtra Cricket Association.

The three-day match will be held from October 29 to 31 while the limited-overs match is billed for November 1.

The tourists travel to Baroda on the last leg of their tour.

They will take on the last season's Ranji Trophy champions in a three-dayer beginning November 4 before wrapping up

their visit with a 50-over game on

November 7 against the same opponents. Initially, the Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) selected 14 players for the tour. However, a few of them are being considered for Bangladesh's

home series against Zimbabwe next

month and might be called back mid-way through the tour. However, selector Tanjeeb Ahsan Saad did not disclose the names of the likely players in an unscheduled press briefing at the Board's Bangabandhu Stadium

office Friday. Coach Dipu Rai Choudhury, manager Mahmud UI Hag were also present during the briefing.

About the tour preparations, Dipu said they had almost four

months of training, which was probably unprecedented as far as Bangladesh goes.

He believed that every member of his team was fit and ready to take on the Indians.

"We have an efficient side with a handful of young and enthusiastic cricketers. They are raring to play for the national team and India would be their testing ground," said Dipu, the former national cricketer.

Dipu thought that the conditions in India would be similar to those in Bangladesh.

Mahmud also assured that his teammates would try their best to win all their matches.

Pakistan's Wasim Akram and Rashid Latif have come out in support of a prominent Test captain's suggestion that players, umpires and administrators undergo lie-

detector tests every six months. "I have no problems with that if the purpose is to help clean the game of corruption," former Pakistan captain Akram told this news agency.

Latif, the Pakistan wicketkeeper who played a leading role in exposing match-fixing, said: "It is a good move. It might meet with resistance from some quarters. But they should go ahead with this plan.

The idea of lie-detector tests was made by "a prominent Test captain" in an International Cricket Council (ICC) survey, aimed at putting the burden of responsibility to clean up the game on the captains.

Akram, who was fined last year for not co-operating fully with a match-fixing inquiry commission in Pakistan, said he felt the legal ramifications of having players undergo lie-detector tests needed to

A non-complying country would be hit by a 2-million-dollar fine or if greater, the budgeted gross revenue for the tour, if the proposal is

agreed. But countries would be exempt from penalties where fixtures had been cancelled due to such things as natural disaster, war or where the safety of players was proved to be at

"The aim of the penalty proposals is to protect the integrity of the Future Tours Programme," ICC communications manager Mark Harrison told this news agency on

"There will be exceptions. Obviously, it would be grossly insensitive to make a team go to a country where security cannot be

"But I would underline that they are just proposals at the present time and not policy.'

Under the 10-year ICC rolling programme, each of the 10 Test playing nations are scheduled to play each other both home and away with points awarded for series victories.

For Test tours, under the propos als the non-offending country would also receive two ICC Test Championship points, as though it had won the series.

Next week's meeting will also discuss proposals to introduce tougher measures on player discipline and the feasibility of a one-day

international world rankings system. A wide range of other issues will be discussed in Kuala Lumpur.

"We have asked the board to increase penalties for on-field misbehaviour," said ICC chief executive Malcolm Speed. "We seek to remove the limit on the referee's ability to fine players, currently limited to 75 percent of the player's match fee.

"We have asked it to remove the limit on the period of suspension, currently limited to three Test matches or six one-day internationals. There will be no upper limits on fines and suspensions.

Speed said the ICC did not want to change the fiercely competitive

nature of international cricket. "What we seek is to remove sledging (verbal abuse) and excessive appealing from the game

entirely," he said. The corruption scandal, which has tarnished the game's image since former South Africa captain Hansie Cronie admitted taking money from bookmakers last year.


