Inter Milan coach Hector Cuper hopes Sunday evening's trip to Udinese will be the perfect opportunity for his Italian First Division leaders to find the one ingredient missing from his side this season -

Inter have laboured their way to the top relying on grit and no small luck as they have put together four wins and a draw in five matches.

Argentinian Cuper admits he is delighted to be at the summit but he added: "But I like my teams to play well too. Being top is great but I hope we can improve.

Whatever the rights and wrongs things are looking up for Inter.

Brazilian Ronaldo and Christian Vieri are returning to full fitness and Uruguayan Alvaro Recoba looks set to have his one-year ban for possessing a bogus passport greatly

The hosts from Udine, managed by former Inter coach Roy Hodgson have personnel problems. Chilean David Pizarro and striker Roberto Muzzi are both suspended while defender Marco Zamboni is injured.

Hodgson may have to recall Argentinian Roberto Sosa who scored 14 goals last term but has been out of favour with the English-

But by the time Inter and Udinese take the field at the Stadio Friuli Serie A's Cinderella club Chievo may have hit the top on their own for

The newly-promoted outfit,

based in Verona and who have never played in front of a 10,000 crowd at home, travel to Brescia hoping to clinch top spot at least for a few hours and make it five wins out

Chievo will be boosted by the news that Brescia coach Carlo Mazzone will be kept away from the action as he begins his five-match touchline ban for his astonishing

antics during and after the 3-3 Lombardy derby draw with Atalanta.

Mazzone taunted fans from the visiting club from Bergamo, even going as far as to suggest the city's women earned their income by immoral means.

The Chievo match could be an ideal chance for Mazzone to give Spanish midfielder Josep Guardiola, the former Barcelona idol, his first outing for his new club.

Juventus host Stadio Delle Alpi co-tenants Torino in the Turin derby. The "vecchia signora" (old lady), as Juventus are known in Italy, is showing signs of fatigue after a fine start to the season and are now winless in four games in all competi-

They have yielded top spot to Inter and will be determined to get back to winning ways at home to their once-mighty rivals who are now something of a 'yo-yo' club they go up one season and down

AC Milan also came a cropper last time out in the league but will be confident of victory at home to bottom club Venezia

Venezia have lost all five matches since returning to the top flight and this week coach Cesare Prandelli was sacked, with goalkeeping coach Sergio Buso in temporary charge.

Southerners Lecce host Fiorentina whose star striker Enrico Chiesa ruled out for the season. The club that has been threatened with bankruptcy can not afford a replace-

#### Primera Liga preview Recoba can play from October 31

Italian sports chiefs have slashed eight months off the one-year ban imposed on Inter Milan's Uruguayan striker Alvaro Recoba for his role in the bogus passports affair, ANSA news agency reported Friday.

Recoba will be eligible to return to competitive action on October 31 with his first game likely to be the league match with Lecce at the San Siro on November 4.

Inter's director of sport Gabriele Oriali who will also be welcomed back into the football fraternity on December 31. Oriali, a member of Italy's 1982 World Cup winning side, had also been punished with a one-

The imminent return of Recoba, 25 and dubbed 'El Chino', is a massive boost for Inter's Argentinian coach Hector Cuper whose side are top of the league

Recoba was one of many players enmeshed in the bogus passports affair last season which first exploded when Latin American players with Italian First Division side Udinese were arrested with false documents by Polish border

## Can Betis end Celta run?

Real Betis can thank other clubs for their place on top of the Spanish league, with 16 points from seven games, but they will deserve to pat themselves on the back if they can win at Celta Vigo on Sunday and remain in pole position.

Celta are still unbeaten this season, they lie fourth only three points behind Betis, and their Balaidos stadium is an imposing citadel where visiting teams usually struggle to get even a point.

The Galicians have not lost at home in the league since January this year and the memory still lingers of the 5-1 thrashing Celta gave Betis the last time the Andalusian side visited, two years ago.

"Playing at home at the Balaidos is like having an extra player," Celta coach Victor Fernandez has said on more than one occasion.

"It isn't the biggest ground in the Spanish First Division (with a capacity of 31,800, the Balaidos is less than a third of the size of Barcelona's Nou Camp) but we get good crowds every time we play there and they support the team right up to the hilt "added Fernandez

For the last few years the 21,000 socios - supporters' club members have often had plenty to cheer thanks to Fernandez and his attacking brand of football

The 13 goals they have scored is second only to neighbours Deportivo La Coruna and they would have bagged plenty more if their Spanish international striker Catanha had been more accurate and added to his tally of three goals.

It is not a statistic that the Brazilian-born player will want reminding of, but he leads the Spanish First Division marksmen in off-target

Betis for their part will want to bounce back after their humiliating 4-1 defeat on Wednesday in the Spanish Cup by Ceuta, with three of the Third Division outfit's goals

coming in extra time Despite missing several regular first team players, the Betis side still contained Brazilian international Denilson and the Spanish First Division's joint leading goal scorer,

Argentine striker Gaston Casas. "It was an embarrassment. They deserved to win and we paid the price for not concentrating. It will teach all our players a valuable lesson and maybe it will pay dividends in the league." said a humble Betis coach Juande Ramos.

Betis have a two point advantage over second-placed Barcelona, who play host to Valencia on Sunday.

Nobody has yet forgotten the corresponding fixture of the last campaign, the last match of the

season, when a spectacular overhead shot from Rivaldo in the dying seconds completed his hat-trick and gave Barcelona a 3-2 victory.

The win also had the effect of

securing Barcelona's place in this season's Champions' League, and relegating last season's Champions' League finallists to the UEFA

"What happened last season is still on everyone's minds, but it should be remembered that perhaps Valencia are the one team that isn't frightened by going to the Nou Camp. Our results in recent seasons prove that we can give as good as we get when we go there," said Valencia coach Rafa Benitez.

With his returning legions of international players, Benitez is expected to recall the likes of his Argentine duo of Pablo Aimar and Roberto Ayala, who were on World Cup duty for their country while Valencia were scrapping a 1-0 win over Villarreal last Sunday to remain - along with Celta Vigo - one of only two clubs in the Spanish First Division who are unbeaten

Barcelona, despite an extensive injury list, survived without any further casualties Wednesday's Champions' League match against Olympique Lyon, which they won 2-0, and are expected to name the same side

At the foot of the table, bottom club Rayo Vallecano play secondto-bottom Real Sociedad.

Sociedad coach John Toshack knows that his job is on the line. even if he is reluctant to admit it, with his club still without a win this season and having crashed out of the Spanish Cup on Wednesday, losing 2-1 to Third Division Hospitalet.

"I'm not going to talk my personal situation because I am still convinced this team can recover their composure," said the grim-faced Welshman on Thursday.

Defending champions Real Madrid can feel confident of getting some points from their visit to

Real may currently be languishing in an unfamiliar 13th place in the Spanish First Division, but have beaten the Basque club 3-1 on their trips there in the last two seasons and have not been beaten in the league at Alaves for 47 years.

In their last match, they were beaten by lowly VfL Wolfsburg and lost their one hundred percent record in the process.


Bayern hope to take advantage of their rivals' shock at losing that game by leapfrogging them to claim

## Parma divided over Afghanistan

Parma's multi-ethnic football team numbering Christians, Muslims, Atheists as well as players from Africa, Europe, the Americas and Asia - has been divided by the American-led military action in Afghanistan in response to the September 11 attacks.

Friday's Gazzetto dello Sport interviewed players in one of the most multinational teams in the cosmopolitan Italian First Division and found a mix of responses to the raids first launched on Sunday night by US president George W. Bush.

Brazil's 1994 World Cup winning goalkeeper Claudio Taffarel, a Protestant convert who previously played for Istanbul side Galatasaray, said he was worried by Islamic fundamentalism.

"Muslims, even the best ones, are made like that," said Taffarel. "They think they are better than anyone else, they are the only ones who know the truth. I spent so many years in Turkey and my friends in Istanbul always tried to convince me to become a Muslim, become like

"There is no respect for others, that's why I am afraid: radicalism terrifies me

Stephen Appiah, from Ghana, disagreed. "I am a Catholic, in my country I have always lived side-byside with Muslims and I have never

because Bush wanted it. But he is wrong. You can not bomb a whole country to get one man."

Yugoslav striker Savo Milosevic. a Serb who demonstrated against NATO airstrikes in his homeland and also participated in the demonstrations that helped oust Slobodan Milosevic from power, said: "I have an incredible fear... (Osama) Bin Laden and his friends are abusing Islam, I have many friends who pray to Allah but none of them would dream of going and attacking the

Midfielder Sabri Lamouchi, a Frenchman of Arab descent and a Muslim, opined: "I can not believe a man can do what Bin Laden did. would not let my daughter see what happened in New York, not now or ever. Japanese midfielder Hidetoshi Nakata, an Atheist, said: "Bin Laden got it wrong, so did the United States.'

The club's coach Renzo Ulivieri. who as a child survived Allied bombing raids during World War II, said: "Always fight against terrorism, but never go to war. I am one of that naive group of people who thinks you can work things out. I am happy to be naive."

Koubadya Kader, a Muslim from Togo, added: "I am a Muslim but Westerners must know that Bin Laden has nothing to do with us or Allah. In the Koran it is written that to

## Can China keep Bora?

China's football heroes take on Qatar Saturday already safely qualified for their first-ever World Cup Finals, but doubts over the future of their charismatic coach are threatening to spoil the party atmosphere. Bora Milutinovic secured China's

place in Japan and South Korea next year with the side's 1-0 win over Oman last Sunday, giving him the chance to lead out a recordbreaking fifth nation at the world's greatest football event. But the question now vexing

Chinese fans is whether a new challenge will lure away the welltravelled Serb before the tournament begins. It was long known Milutinovic's
