

Govt withdraws appeal

After a round of whirlwind diplomacy in Shanghai, US President George W Bush won strong backing from Asia Pacific leaders yesterday for his war on terrorism.

A declaration at the end of a summit of leaders of the 21-member Asia Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) forum stopped short of endorsing US-led strikes on Afghanistan or naming Osama bin Laden, the prime suspect in the September 11 attacks on America.

But it said leaders "unequivocally condemn in the strongest terms" the hijack attacks on the World Trade Center and Pentagon, which rocked the US economy and sent tremors through Asian nations that rely on US export markets.

A US official said Washington was "thrilled" by the statement, the first-ever political stand by APEC, which mustered support despite misgivings by predominantly Muslim Indonesia and Malaysia

Russia and China have both made clear they want the hostilities to end as soon as possible.
