## Water tank collapses at AJM: One dies

UNB, N'ganj

A huge dilapidated water tank at Adamjee Jute Mill-2 collapsed at 5 pm yesterday killing a man and injuring seven others.

An unidentified man aged about 45 died on the spot. The injured were rushed to the Sadar Hospital.

Witnesses said some persons might still be under the debris, which was being cleared by crane brought from the Roads and Highways Department. The salvage work was still going on at 8-20 pm yesterday.

The dilapidated water tank with a 60-gallon capacity and placed 50 feet above ground collapsed with a big bang when workers under a contractor were repairing it, witnesses said.

South Asian Studies at Jawaharlal Nehru University and AKM Abdul Sabur, acting research director of the BIIS, Former Foreign Secretary Farooq Sobhan moderated the session.

Dr SMD Muni from India said that in the South Asian context, the task of building mutual confidence was approached in a very unconventional manner -- through economic and socio-cultural cooperation alone.

The SAARC was built on these foundations, avoiding reference to political and military issues of conflict among the member countries, he pointed out.

"Acceptance of the broader base of CBMs was inherent in the approach. But not many in South Asia are convinced that the SAARC has yielded desired results. The blame in this respect is generally put on the two most powerful members of SAARC -- India and Pakistan," Dr Muni observed.

Dr Pervaiz Iqbal Cheema from Pakistan said, "South Asia is known to be the poorest, the most illiterate, the most malnourished and the most deprived region of the world. Yet it continues to make much more investments in the defence sector than in education or health of the people.

Dr Cheema suggested that leaders in both countries realise dictates of the 21st century and make concerted efforts to move away from hostilities and to encourage cooperation.

He said any device or mechanism that helps, however remotely it may be, lower tensions and facilitate cooperation would have adequate relevance to South Asia. "Admittedly, the CBMs have not been as successful as they have been in Europe or Middle East or Latin America or South East Asia, their utility cannot be altogether written off."

Dr AKM Abdul Sabur, the BIIS acting research director, said the need for enhancing cooperation at the regional and global level is felt increasingly.

"While the Asian countries are increasingly being integrated into the world economy at the regional

level, even the slow process of cooperation has been brought to a standstill," he continued.
