Bonsai training

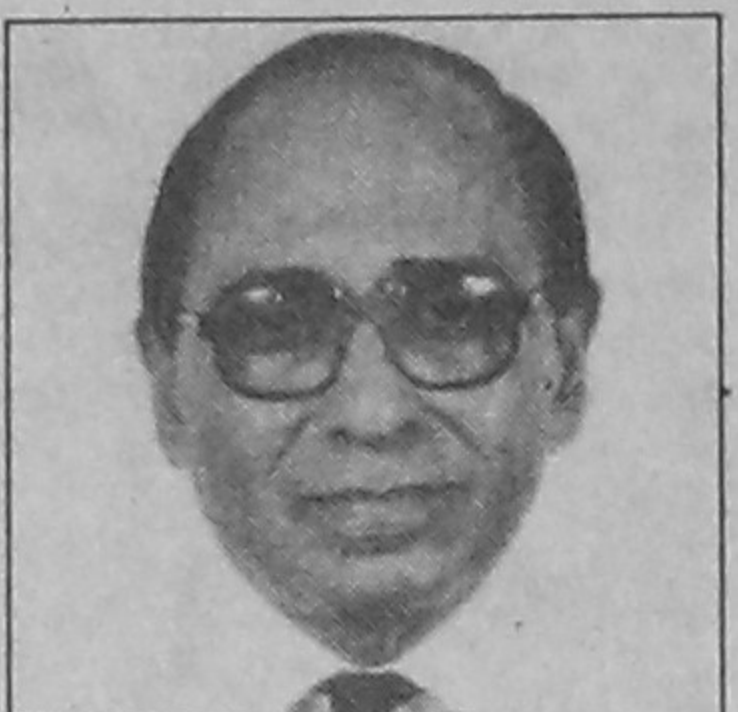
Bangladesh Bonsai Society is organising a two-and-a-half-month-long Bonsai Training session from November 9, says a press release.

He left behind one daughter and a host of relatives to mourn his death.

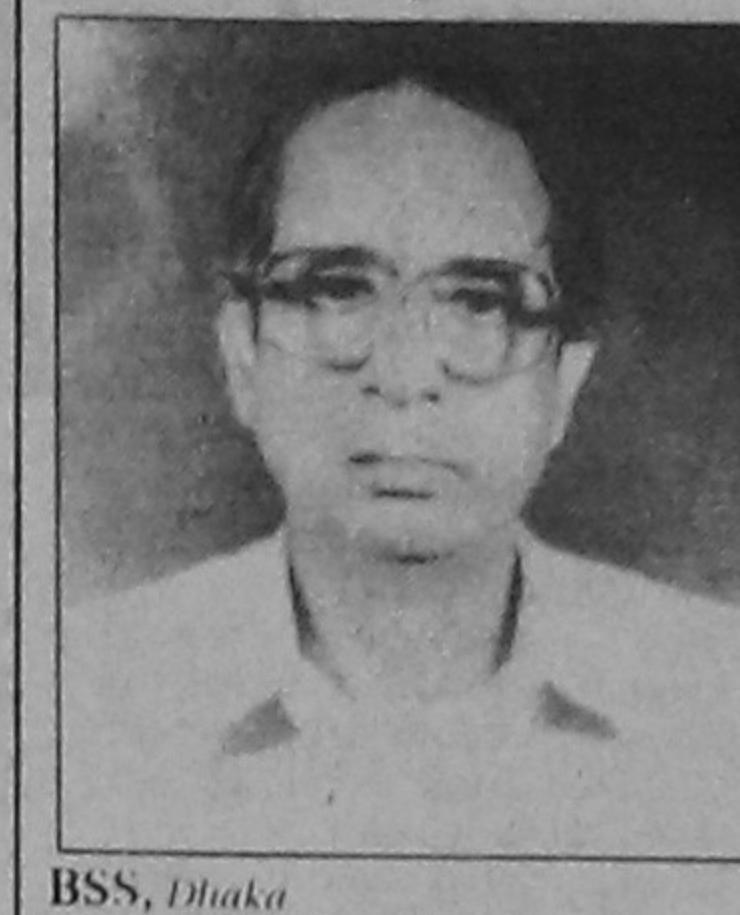
Conspirators won't be able to dampen spirit of Nov 7

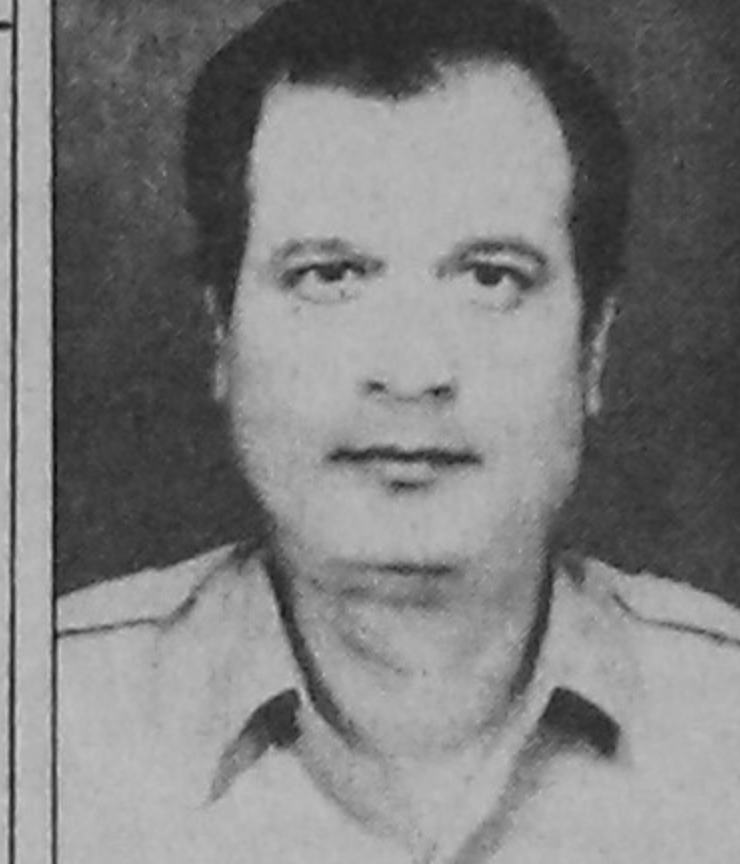
Light rain likely
