Major vacancies hamper IU activities

Vacancies for some important posts, including that of vicechancellor (VC), at the Islamic University (IU) have slowed its administrative activities to a crawl.

The posts of treasurer, proctor, student advisor, transport administrator and press officer follow the trail of vacancies.

The immediate-past IU vicechancellor, Professor Lutfor Rahman, resigned on November 3 under pressure of some teachers aligned with the Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP) and the Jamaat-e-Islami. He was appointed vice-chancellor on October 19, 2000 for a four-year term. Earlier, the BNP-backed Zia Parishad and the Jamaat-backed Green Forum had delivered an ultimatum to the IU VC to step down by October 30. The VC could not perform any duty other than routine work after take-over of power by the BNP-led four-party alliance.

The proctor resigned on October 21. Moreover, the post of treasurer has been lying vacant since September 4 and that of student advisor since August 15.

Insiders have attributed the stalemate to political crisis, which is also hampering the process of admission to the university in the first year honours.

When contacted, an influential teacher of the IU Zia Parishad said, "We met the minister and the state minister for education yesterday (Friday) to hold talks on the

The approach of the education ministry to the issue is altogether laid-back, he claimed. "Only IU Chancellor Prime Minister Khaleda Zia can decide on the appointment of VC and treasurer."

According to the University Act, the chancellor can appoint any new vice-chancellor to any university at anytime.

For the post of VC, the authorities concerned are looking for a competent and eligible person with loyalty to the nationalist

Meanwhile, some teachers of the IU and of other universities have started lobbying political high-ups for appointment to the important posts.

Nineteen candidates have been enlisted for the post of vicechancellor. Among them are Prof Sahadat Hossain Mondol of the Department of Zoology, Prof Abdur Rahman Siddiqi of the Department of Sociology, Prof Faisul Islam Faruqi of the Department of Physics, Prof Kader Bhuivan, Prof Mozammel Huq of the Depart-ment of Physics, from Rajshahi

University (RU); and Prof Mahfuz Ahmed, Bangladesh Agriculture University (BAU) and Prof Kamrul Ahsan Chowdhury of the Department of Sociology, Dhaka University (DU), and Prof Siddiq Ahmed Chowdhury of Department of Public Administration, Chittagong University.

Of them, either Prof Kamrul Ahsan Chowdhury, also president of the DU Zia Parishad, or Prof AKM Sahadat Hossain Mondol, also vice-president of the RU Zia Parishad, may be appointed vice-

Files with several proposed names for the appointment of the VC have been dispatched to the prime minister's office for the fourth time, with the last one proposing Prof Kamrul Ahsan Chowdhury.

Earlier, Sahadat Hossain was rumoured to have been appointed vice-chancellor.

The Zia Parishad homed in on BNP-aligned, progressive persons like Sahadat Hossain, while the Jamaat-aligned teachers belonging to the IU Green Forum are interested in someone like Prof Kamrul

About five teachers including Prof Kamrul Huda and Prof Idris Ali are lobbying for the post of treasurer.
