Muttiah mazes Windies

Off-spinner Muttiah Muralitharan led a Sri Lankan fight-back with a six-wicket haul on the second day of the first cricket Test against the West

Indies here Wednesday. The bowling wizard triggered a West Indies collapse by taking the prize scalp of Brian Lara (178), with the final six wickets falling for just 25 runs to end the tourists' innings on

Muralitharan finished with 6-126, his 29th five-wicket haul in Tests, and he was well supported by leftarm seamer Chaminda Vaas, who took the other four wickets.

Sri Lanka then survived the early dismissal of skipper Sanath with opener Marvan Atapattu (46) and Kumar Sangakkara (27) at the Jayasuriya slammed a 19-ball 25

before being caught at point by Neil McGarrell off fast bowler Mervyn Dillon. But opener Atapattu and Sangakkara steadied the innings

with an unbroken 66-run stand for the second wicket. The West Indies found no one to

prop up their innings after Lara fell in the session after lunch. The tourists, guided by the

resurgent Lara, were strongly placed at 423-4 before succumbing to the home team's disciplined spinpace combination. The 29-year-old Muralitharan,

testing the batsmen with his turn and flight, claimed the vital wicket of edged a sweep to be caught by diving wicketkeeper Sangakkara.

and looked set to put his team on course for a massive total before the Sri Lankan bowlers struck. Vaas kept up the pressure from the other end. accounting for Ridlev
