### **Ramadan: Prices** of essentials increase in city

Prices of essentials including those of fruits and vegetables commonly consumed during the Ramadan shot up in city markets yesterday.

Onion, used in almost every lftar item, was selling at Tk 28 per kg at Karwan Bazar wholesale market against Tk 22 last week. The annual demand for onion in

the country is about five lakh metric tonnes against a production of around one lakh tonnes.

Traders said prices of all most all items used in Iftar shot up due to increased demand and insufficient supply in the market. They however said some unscrupulous wholesale traders have raised the prices.


Two businessmen were murdered in separate incidents in the city in the last 24 hours ending at 10 pm yesterday.
