### Bradmans vexed at news reports

Donald Bradman's family say they are saddened and distressed at newspaper articles about the personal and business past of Australia's greatest cricketer.

His son John Bradman said it was unfair The Australian newspaper had waited until after his father's death to publish the allegations when Bradman was unable to defend himself.

An article in The Australian last week guoted Bradman's nephew Paul Bradman alleging the cricket great had cut himself off from his parents, siblings and their children.

The following day the paper alleged Bradman had been complicit in fraudulent dealings at the Adelaide stockbrokers which employed him from 1935 until it was bankrupted by financial scandal in

In a statement Thursday, the Bradman family and the Bradman Foundation said they were disappointed the newspaper chose to wait some eight months after the cricket legend's death to publish the

This had deprived him of a right of reply to material that would "clearly have been defamatory of him and his family", it said.

"The publication of these articles has caused a considerable amount of distress and sadness amongst members of the family and the foundation," it said

John Bradman added: "My dad was a decent person and scrupulously honest ... it is unfair this material has been published when my dad is not able to defend him-

The statement said the Bradman family and foundation would not respond to "each and every allegation of wrongdoing or unfairness" made in the articles or in the future.

However they would act together

to protect Bradman's reputation from "unscrupulous abuse or exploitation".

. Bradman died last February at

his Adelaide home, aged 92. His wife, Jessie Bradman, passed away in 1997.

Justin Langer made New Zealand pay dearly for a duffed catch to register his third successive Test century as Australia ransacked the bowling on the opening day of the second cricket Test at the Bellerive Oval here Thursday.

Langer, who survived a strident bw appeal in the first over of the opening Brisbane Test before going on to score a century, profited from a spilt catch off his sixth ball Thursday to compile 123, his 10th

Langer was put down by Matthew Bell in the gully off Daryl Tuffey's first ball of the Test when on

"You always have a bit of luck batting in the top order, but if he (Bell) had taken that catch it would have been sensational because I absolutely smoked it," said Langer.

Australia suffered another midafternoon flutter of wickets, similar to the first day in Brisbane, but by stumps had scorched along to 411-6 at a blistering scoring rate of 4.5 runs per over.

Tasmanian Ricky Ponting was delighting his home state supporters to be on the verge of his ninth Test century on 92 not out with Shane Warne on 31

But the first day's play belonged to the breezy batting of Langer, who posted his third consecutive Test hundred after his 102 against England in the fifth Ashes Test at The Oval in August and 104 in Brisbane

At one stage Langer was on target to join a select group of players to score a century before lunch on the first day, being 59 after the first hour before his scoring rate moderated in the hour to lunch.

"The first hour was a bit surreal to me. I didn't deliberately go out there thinking I was going to be super-aggressive, but they probably gave me a few loose balls than they should have in the first hour of the Test match," said Langer.

"Four hundred and 11 runs in a day in Test cricket is a magnificent effort and we're in a great position. "Life's pretty good, innit? Three Test centuries in a row or three


