AL move for all-party nat'l convention hits a snag

Left-leaning parties prefer a convention of their own

REAZ AHMAD

The Awami League move for an allparty national convention denouncing violation of human rights across the country has hit a snag with leftleaning political parties expressing unwillingness to get directly involved in the process.

The left-leaning parties are instead contemplating a separate programme from an independent platform beyond the purview of the traditional AL-BNP polarisation.

The AL conceived the idea of organising an all-party national convention on "crimes against humanity" to denounce atrocities, perpetrated against its leaders and workers, the religious minorities and the public, allegedly by members of the ruling alliance.

It has also initiated a series of dialogues to muster support from other "progressive and proliberation forces" with a view to holding the convention in early January next year.

The party has not yet formed a steering committee for the mooted convention in the hope that some other political parties it has held talks with will join in


AL President and Leader of the Opposition in Parliament Sheikh Hasina has so far had meetings with leaders of the Communist Party of Bangladesh (CPB), Workers Party of Bangladesh, Samyabadi Dal and Gano Azadi League, all components of the 11-party alliance. Except the Azadi League, the three others are also components of the Left Democratic Front (LDF).

Meanwhile, AL sources told The Daily Star that the leftist parties had not yet made up their mind about the national convention. They would let the party know

their position on the issue following deliberations at the LDF and the 11party alliance levels.

Conversely, leftist leaders, who have already had talks with Hasina, told The Daily Star that while they appreciated the AL initiative, they could not be directly involved in the process and had, therefore, declined the AL proposa

NCTB sure of printing textbooks on time marketing of textbooks, the sources

Printing of textbooks is on in full swing as the government is determined to reach textbooks to primary and secondary school students by first week of January for the 2002 academic year, education ministry sources said.

According to the National Curriculum and Textbook Board (NCTB), 296 printing houses in the capital are working round the clock to print nearly 20 million copies of 60 textbooks for the secondary level.

Meanwhile, 150 other printers are contracted to publish 473 millions copies of textbooks for the primary level.

The printers have a December 15 deadline to meet while binding of the books will begin the following week, NCTB sources said. The government has formed 20

monitoring teams to supervise progress of printing, binding, distribution and marketing of the text-A seven-member high-powered

taskforce, headed by the NCTB chairman, has also been formed to supervise the activities of the monitoring teams. The taskforce is taking on-the-spot decision to expedite the entire process of printing, binding, distribution and

The government has also ensured supply of adequate paper for printing the books. The Karnaphuli Paper Mills has so far produced 2868.26 tonnes of paper for printing textbooks for primary level and 1032.80 tonnes of paper for printing textbooks for junior and secondary levels.

In cases of emergencies, paper is also being borrowed from the Primary and Mass Education Division.

"The work is progressing fast and the whole thing is moving smoothly," State Minister for Education Ehsanul Haque Milon, who has been designated to oversee the developments, told BSS yesterday.

He said that under any circumstance students would get their books by the first week of January. "It needs at least four months to

finish such a huge task. But we didn't get adequate time," he said adding that it would have been better had the process been initiated four months ago.

The state minister described speculation over delay in printing as

cauliflower, cabbage, tomato, radish, beans, carrot and lady's finger have appeared in the city markets before Ramadan, but their prices are still high. According to a random survey in

different kitchen markets in the city, the price of one kilogram tomatoes ranges between Tk 55 and Tk 60, beans Tk 20 and Tk 26, potatoes Tk 8 and Tk 10. cucumbers Tk 30 and Tk 40 and brinials Tk 16 and Tk 20.

Per kg patal sells at Tk 12, pea at Tk

A standard sized cauliflower sells at Tk 10 to Tk 16, a cabbage at Tk 8 to Tk 15, pumpkin at Tk 25 to Tk 40 and bottle gourd at Tk 15 to Tk 20.

28 and bitter gourd at Tk 20.

In the spice market, the price was on the same curve. Onion sells at Tk 26 per kilogram, garlic at Tk 40 to Tk 50, green-chilli at Tk 30 to Tk 35, dried chilli at Tk 55 and ginger at Tk 30 to Tk 35. The prices of coriander, cumin, capsicum, cardamom, cinnamon, cassia-leaf and other spices have also soared ahead of
