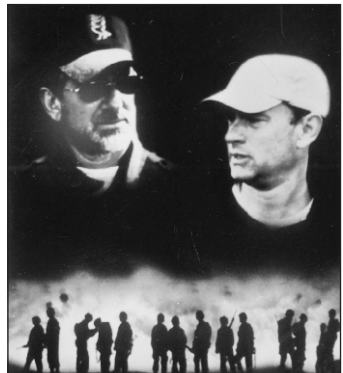
Law & Order: Special Victims Unit on Star World on December 4 at 8:00 & 11:30 p.m.

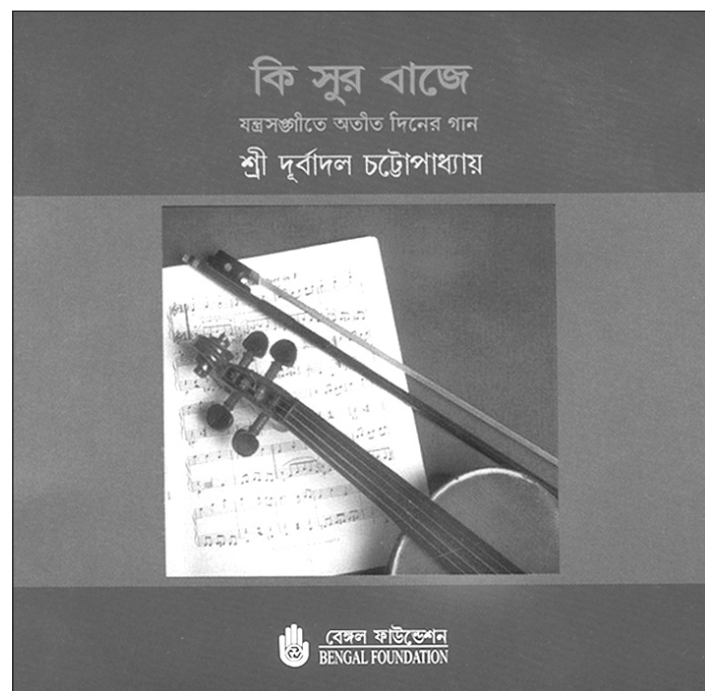


Matilda on HBO December 1 at 10:00 PM

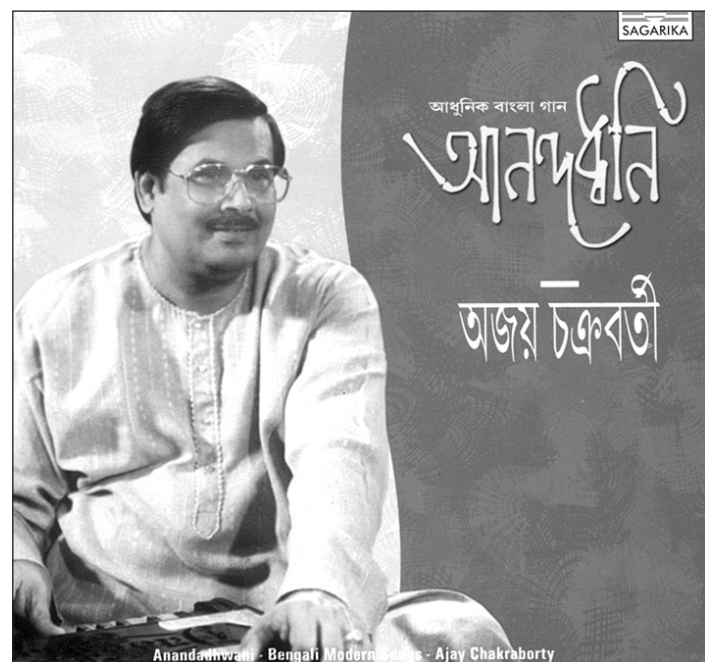
Band of Brothers 07: The Breaking Point on HBO December 3rd at 10:00 pm

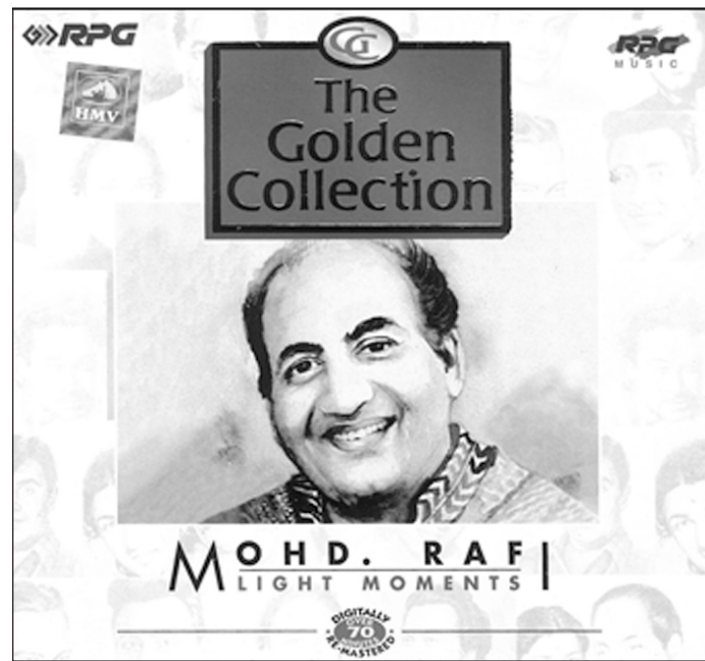

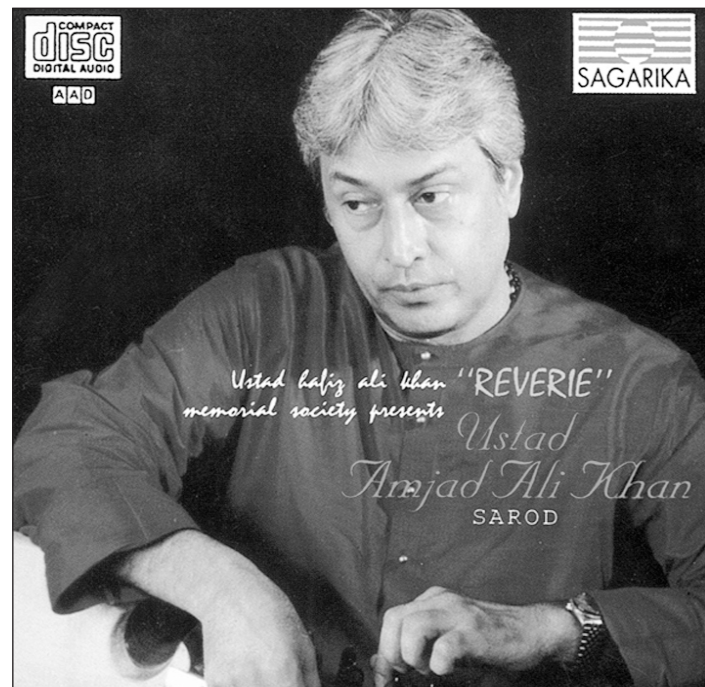

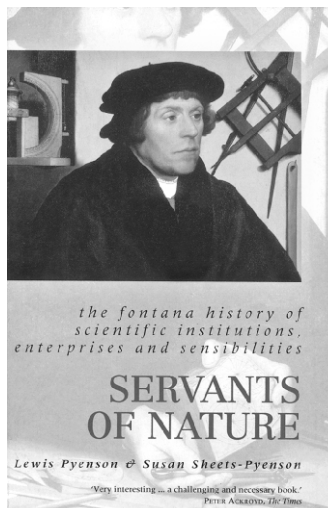


Interior Color by Design

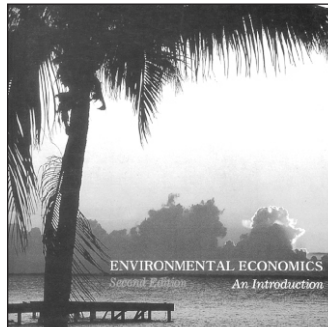

By Lewis Pyenson & Susan Sheets-Pyenson, Tk 845/-

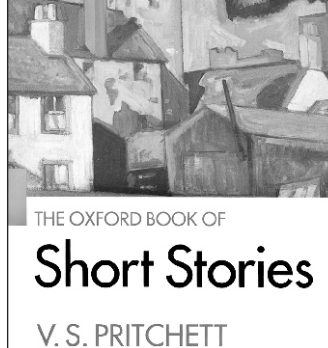

By Barry C. Field, Tk. 975.00

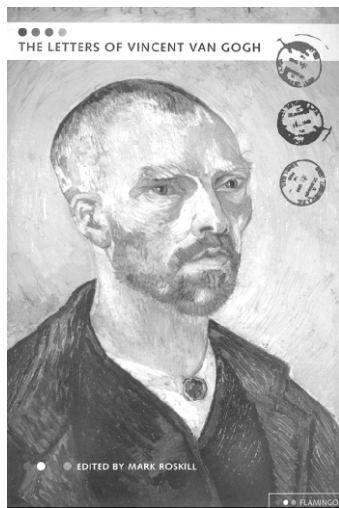

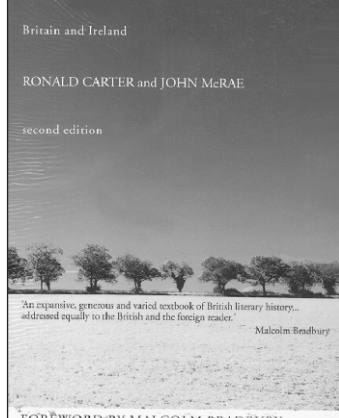
The Letters of Vincent Van Gogh

That Vincent van Gogh was one of the greatest painters in the history of European art is now generally accepted. That he was a man of high intelligence and tender affections these letters abundantly establish. By their directness and humility they bring us an intimate understanding of genius. To anyone interested in painting or in the mind of a creative artist they are indispensable.

But what makes them of supreme importance is their fascination for people who have, in the ordinary way, no particular interest in the arts. It is the human spirit, not the fame of the artist, that is the secret of their perennial attraction.

This selection by Professor Mark Roskill, who contributes an introduction and notes, also includes the memoir of van Gogh written by his sister-in-law.

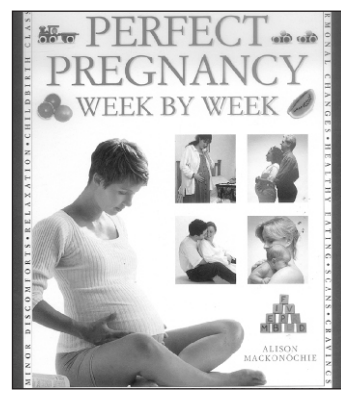


The Routledge History of Literature in English

This is a completely updated and expanded second edition of the wide-ranging and accessible Routledge History of Literature in English. It covers the main developments in the history of British and Irish literature and has extensive accompanying language notes which explore the inter-relationships between language and literature.

With a span from AD 600 to the present day, it emphasises the growth of literary writing, its traditions, conventions and changing characteristics, and includes literature from the margins, both geographical and cultural. Extensive quotes from poetry, prose and drama underpin the narrative.



Perfect Pregnancy

The Diaries of Franz Kafka

Edited by Max Brod, Tk 375/-

Franz Kafka is perhaps the most enigmatic and paradoxical writer of the early twentieth century literature. Along with his short stories, novels and letters his diaries too reveal to us the extraordinary inner world in which he lived. More explicitly than anywhere else, it is here that he describes his fear, isolation, frustration, feelings of guilt and the sense of being an outcast. It also offers glimpses of his unhappy love affairs and his difficult relationship with his father. Kafka's diaries cover the period from 1910 to 1923, the year before his premature death.

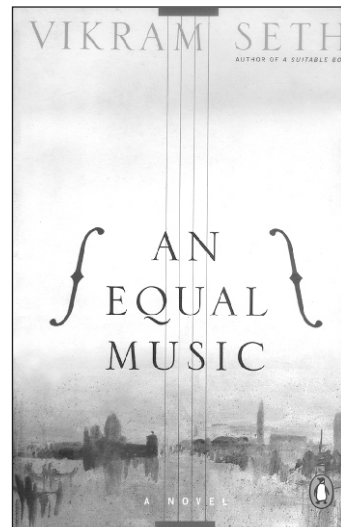


Dust on the Road

She was also awarded the Padmasree in 1986, for her activist work amongst dispossessed tribal communities.



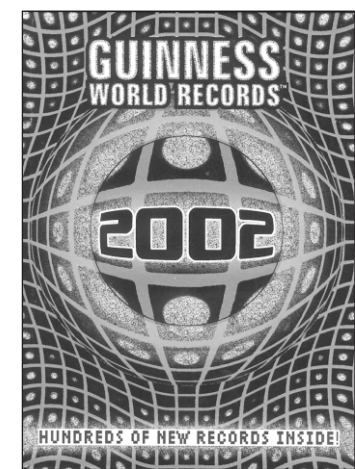
An Equal Music

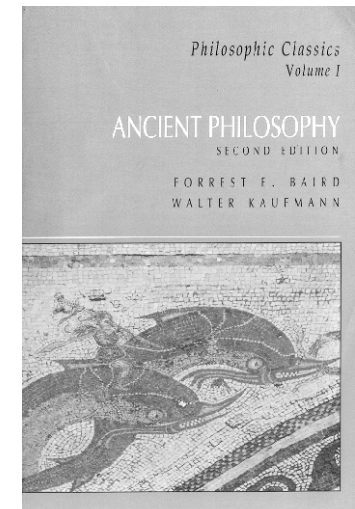
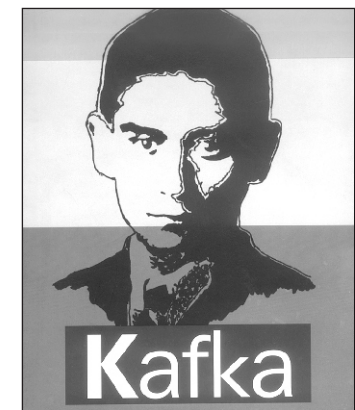
This is also a book about music and about how the love of music can run like a passionate theme through a life. Above all, it is a book to savour and re-read.

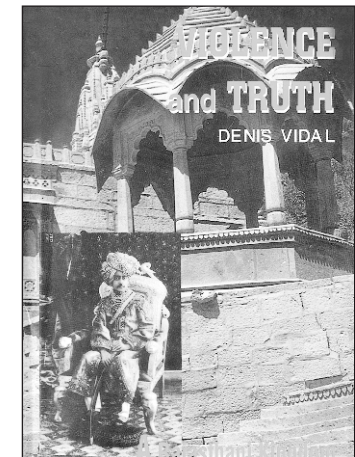
