Harrison, who played a key role in raising funds for Bangladesh during the Liberation War, passed away on November 30 in Los An-


George Harrison and Ravi Shanker jointly organised the concert titled "Concert for Bangladesh" at the Madison Square Garden in New York on August 1, 1971 to help the war-affected people in Bangladesh.

Among other noted artistes, Bob Dylan, Eric Clapton, Ringo Starr and Billy Preston also took part in the concert.

About 40 thousand people were present at the concert and the proceeds from the concert were donated for the welfare of war victims.

The Liberation War Museum expressed deep shock at the death of Harrison and expressed sympathy for the grieving family.
