Although the Tk 1,633 crore power plant project could not yet be kicked off, construction of dormitories for its employees is nearing

The World Health Organisation recommends the Directly Observed Treatment Strategy (DOTS) to control TB and prevent multi-drug resistance. The DOTS strategy entails increased commitment, effective diagnosis, standard treatment, secure drug supply and systematic monitoring and supervi-

"One of the main reasons for our failure to reach the target is (lack of) monitoring and supervision. As eight national consultants are missing since last June, so the rate may further decline in the coming months," said a source at the Directorate of Health on condition of anonymity yesterday.

He also said, "The key to success lies with the civil surgeons but they don't hold regular meeting to discuss the constraints and so the lapse. At field level, health workers are not educating people about the spread of TB and no case reporting is recorded.'

Considering its seriousness, Bangladesh launched the National TB Control Programme (NTP) in 1993 and by 2000 nearly 95 per cent of the population is brought under its coverage. To facilitate the detection, fully equipped laboratory has been set up in almost each of the 460

Clinics, formerly known as TB Clinic, in the country. Of them, 10 are in Dhaka division, three in Sylhet, 11 in Rajshahi, eight each in Khulna and Chittagong and four in Barisal divisions. Besides, there are eight TB segregation hospitals which specially treat TB patients.

In addition, there are 44 Chest

The NGO partners also play a major role in case detection and curing them. Damien Foundation, HEED and BRAC take lead in case detection and achieving success in curing the cases.

The Review and Strategic Plan 2001-2005 prepared in August last said the NTP still depends on preexisting diagnostic facilities in the metropolitan cities. Only six laboratories provide facilities to 550,000 population in Chittagong, two laboratories in Rajshahi city for 300,000 population, and five laboratories in Khulna city for 260,000 population.

About Dhaka city, the document said the NTP has still to expand here. Quality control in the government laboratories is missing and there are laboratories in many civil surgeon's offices which are not

In the recent five-year revised plan, the NTP would spend about US\$ 5 million annually for TB control

Younus Qanooni, the chief delegate of the northern alliance at the Bonn talks, flew in from Germany on Friday to India a longtime supporter of he northern alliance on a four-day visit. This is the first minister-level contact between the Indian government and the new Afghan administration. "I hope the government of

Pakistan knows that their policy of interference has failed in Afghanistan this is the time that we should review the strategy of the past," he said after meetings with Jaswant Singh, the foreign minister, and Lal Krishna Advani, the home India enjoys good relations with
