"This videotape is not authentic," said Riaz Durrani, a spokesman of the Jamiat Ulema-e-Islam, which spearheaded a series of violent pro-Taliban rallies in Pakistan. "Americans made it up after failing to get any evidence against Osama."

Ameeruddin Mughal, a spokesman for the outlawed Harkat-ul Mujahedeen, an Islamic militant group fighting in Indian Kashmir, said the tape showed somebody who resembles bin Laden -- not the Saudi terrorist himself. In the age of computers and digital technology, it's not difficult to make a fake video.

"The aim is to prolong the military operation in Afghanistan," he said.
