### Ban on use of polythene bags Enforcement strategies

to be reviewed today

The Environment and Forest Ministry called an interministerial meeting today to review awareness and enforcement strategies as the ban on use of polythene bags in Dhaka City comes into effect from January 1.

"The meeting will be held at the environment ministry at 11 am to review measures for greater anti-polythene awareness as well as enforcement of the ban," an official of the ministry said.

Meanwhile, Dhaka City Corporation officials and ward commissioners will hold meetings separately today to discuss their role in the campaign.

Earlier the government decided to ban the use of "indiscriminately used and disposed" thin polythene shopping bags in Dhaka metropolitan area from January 1, as the first step to wipe out non-degradable and hazardous element across the country.

A meeting with leaders and activists of different political parties will be held at 10 am tomorrow at the National Press Club audito-

To motivate the people rallies will be held at different points of the city including New Market, Karwan Bazar, Gulshan and Uttara till December 31.



CPB president Manjurul Ahsan Khan and general secretary Mujahidul Islam Selim in a statement yesterday condoled the death of Shanti Dutta.


#### FF Saidur Rahman


