# **SAFF fears Indo-Pak wave** Football

Either India or Pakistan might pull out of the next month's third South Asian Football Federation (SAFF) championship because of the growing political tension between the two neighbouring states, feared

Ironically, the regional football carnival is supposed to begin with India taking on Pakistan on January 26 at the Sher-e-Bangla National Stadium in Mirpur.

Speaking to a crowded press corps, Sultan disclosed that India's stance on severing cricket and hockey ties with Pakistan does not give the organisers any positive signal for a seven-nation meet. That is why it would be wise of us to count either India or Pakistan out of the meet in advance," the BNP lawmaker said. Tension has mounted between

the two nuclear-armed rivals since December 13 when Indian parliament was attacked by five suicide gunmen.

Although the tournament sponsor AFC Marketing Limited has already made the draw and fixture public in Kuala Lumpur last month. Sultan said he would seek suggestion from the SAFF about what to do if any country pulls out.

# Making it Wright

### India the series 1-0

The Indian team's South Africabased physiotherapist. Andrew Leipus, was also asked to continue till the World Cup, scheduled to be held in South Africa in February-March 2003

Dalmiya's announcements set at rest speculation that Wright and Leipus would be sacked due to India's continued poor record outside the sub-continent, where they have not won a Test series since 1986

The Indian Express newspaper

and the national news agency, Press Trust of India, reported last week that Wright was set to be replaced after the England series.

Dalmiya said the BCCI's decision to retain Wright and Leipus was taken after a brainstorming session with the duo, senior players and national selectors here on Saturday. "We discussed how Indian cricket can improve further," said

Dalmiya. "India is the world under-15 champions, the under-19 champions, but when it comes to Test rankings, we are eighth out of 10, ahead of only lowly Zimbabwe and Bangladesh.

"We have asked the players to be more consistent in their performances. I want the players to be accountable, so also the coach, the physio and the selectors.

BCCI sources said Dalmiya took the advice of senior players like captain Sourav Ganguly, master batsman Sachin Tendulkar and spinner Anil Kumble before agreeing to retain Wright.

"The players wanted Wright to continue. There was also no other suitable candidate." the sources said Wright, whose one year contract expired last month, said he was delighted to continue with Indian cricket

career would not be halted again over his controversial bowling action

"I hope that my bowling action would be cleared by the International Cricket Council (ICC) after the rulings of Western Australian University experts," Akhtar told this news agency

Dubbed the "Rawalpindi Express", Akhtar is under scrutiny from the ICC after his action was questioned for a third time in a short career of four years.

He was reported in Australia in 1999 but was cleared by an ICC ruling in March 2000.

Umpires in New Zealand reported his action for a second time in March this year but Akhtar was subsequently given the all clear by a home review panel in April on the basis of the Western Australian

"I have enjoyed my job and am looking forward to the coming year, Wright told AFP.

"India has some very good players and if the team is consistent on the field, it will do very well."

India is scheduled to play a home series against Zimbabwe in February, followed by tours of the West Indies in March and England in June

Wright, a former New Zealand captain who made his mark as coach of English county side Kent, was inducted as India's first foreign coach with much fanfare last November.

He was India's sixth coach in the last five years, the job having been rotated among Ajit Wadekar, Sandeep Patil, Madan Lal, Anshuman Gaekwad and Kapil Dev since 1996


