SAARC to discuss terrorism, says Lankan PM

AFP, New Delhi

Sri Lankan Prime Minister Ranil Wickremesinghe said yesterday that an upcoming South Asian summit would not interfere in bilateral issues between India and Pakistan but would discuss terrorism in the region.

"So far as SAARC is concerned. it (India-Pakistan relations) is a bilateral issue. If SAARC has to become a reality, we have to get cracking on the economic issues," Wickremesinghe told reporters after talks with his Indian counterpart Atal Behari Vajpayee.

SAARC, the South Asian Association of Regional Cooperation, is a grouping of seven South Asian nations and is due to hold its next summit in Kathmandu next week Wickremesinghe said his dis-

Gas, fuel & power

The World Bank in 1996 had suggested the government to increase power tariff by five per cent every six months to adjust it to dollar rate to minimise loss. The price of electricity increased nine times between October, 1996 and November, 2000.

The power sector is mainly suffering losses due to severe financial mismanagement, and not because of low tariff, sources said. Unrealised arrears with the Power Development Board and the Dhaka Electric Supply Authority currently stand at over Tk 5000 crore. Huge power is being systematically pilfered mainly by DESA meter readers and ledger writers. But to recover these losses and to hide the weaknesses, the government is continuing with the policy of increasing tariff, the sources said.

Similarly in the gas sector, unrealised arrears have soared by Tk 1200 crore. So far, there has been no serious move by the government to update the books of Petrobangla and its affiliates. An increase in gas tariff would also affect the power production cost across the country. Gas is the main raw material for power generation.

The Bangladesh Petroleum Corporation (BPC) have been incurring losses by more than Tk 400 crore since 1997-98 when petroleum prices shot up unusually in the international market.

In another incident, two persons --Aleya Begum and Jahangir -- were injured when a fire originating from an earthen woven gutted at least 150 shanties at a slum at Road No 4 in Mohammadpur area at about noon. The slum is locally known as Lat Mia's slum.
