England's Test series in India may have been the subject of more than 400 million pounds worth of illegal

A Daily Telegraph report claims 140 million pound was bet in India on the first two games, with a similar sum was expected to be laid by the

The newspaper echoes the report published earlier this year by International Cricket Council (ICC) Anti-Corruption Unit's (ACU) chief Lord Condon by sugge several murders may be linked to illegal gambling on cricket.

"It is a dangerous world. I met one bookmaker, who didn't want to be named, and he said to me that 19 murders have taken place," an Indian reporter told BBC Radio Five

Mobile phones are used for bets

on cricket as on-course race betting is the only legal way to place wagers in India.

But the Indian reporter has not uncovered any evidence of attempts to involve players in match-fixing during the series.

"What you do is buy or rent a line for a certain sum of money and one line will give you the odds as they change, another line might actually tell you what the big punters are
