Unabated drug trade in Manikganj, Jamalpur

Unabated drug trade is going on in Manikganj and Jamalpur.

Drug trading is going on unabated in different places of Manikganj due to indifferences of the Narcotics Control Department and law enforcing agen-

Locals said different types of "deadly" drugs are being sold almost openly at around two thousand points of Manikganj.

According to different sources, local agents of international mafia gang smuggled drugs into the country from different drug producing countries like India, Pakistan, Thailand, Myanmar and the Philippine. Besides, hemp and alcohol are also being produced at some points of Manikganj.

It is alleged that the officials of Narcotics Control Department are quite reluctant to take action against the drug traders as they also get "share" from the traders on monthly

Modhumoti, Nabaganga dying gradually

Because of unabated siltation and dumping of waste and garbage, once the mighty rivers Modhumoti and Nabaganga, are dying gradually. Other rivers, the Chitra, the Abra and the Kazle have lost their depth. They cannot hold much water during the rainy season, causing flood.

According to the local Water Development. Board, huge quantities of silt are being deposited in the riverbeds because of geological characteristic of the country.

Most of the rivers in the country flow slowly, leaving silt, resulting in emergence of shoals. Silt has been depositing for years together hampering navigation.

Siltation in the Modhumoti and the Nabaganga has also affected other small rivers. Navigation is being hampered seriously due to abnormal fall in water level in the rivers. River transport system in Narail region has been facing clo-

sure threat Transport costs have increased over the years. Many labourers in ferry points and boatmen are now out of job Thousands of acres of croplands go under floodwater

every year. Besides, the nearly dried-up rivers fail to provide irrigation facilities to arable lands. Moreover, they have edged towards a desert, threatening cultivation.
