Understanding the **Muslim Mind**




Reflections on Exile and other Literary and **Cultural Essays**

As the title piece, 'Reflections on Exile', makes clear, the fact of Said's own exile and the fate of the Palestinians have given both form and intimacy to the questions he has pursued. Taken together, these essays give a rare insight into the formation of a critic and the development of an intellectual vocation. They cover a wide and sometimes surprising range of topics from the heroics of Tarzan and the machismo of Ernest Hemingway to the shades of difference that divide Alexandria and Cairo. Said also offers major reconsiderations of writers and artists such as George Orwell, Giambattista Vico, Georg Lukacs, E M Cioran, Naguib Mahfouz, Herman Melville, Joseph Conrad, Antonio Gramsci and Raymond Williams.




Fury


Middle Class and the Social Revolution in Bengal


The Mimic Men




Between Father and Son

Family Letters By V \dot{S} Naipaul, Tk. 780 At seventeen, V.S Naipaul wanted to "follow no other profession" but writing. Awarded a scholarship by the Trinidadian government, he set out to attend Oxford, where he encountered a vastly different world from the one he vearned to leave behind. Separated from his family by continents, and grappling with depression, financial strain, loneliness, and dislocation, "Vido" bridged the distance with a faithful correspondence that began shortly before the young man's two-week journey to England and ended soon after his father's death four years later.






