Liverpool will want to get their Premiership challenge back on track when they travel to title rivals Arsenal on Sunday. The Anfield club's hopes were

dealt a blow Wednesday when improving Southampton beat them 2-0 at the St Mary's Stadium. Liverpool were without Michael

Owen, missing because of an ankle injury and this defeat once again raised questions about their ability to score in the England striker's absence

They now lie fifth, having taken just six points from their last seven games but that still leaves them only a point behind third-placed Arsenal, who are just two points shy of leaders Leeds and have a game in hand. Liverpool assistant manager Phil Thompson insisted his side could recover in the same way as reigning champions Manchester United.

"We will come back," said former Liverpool captain Thompson, who was a cornerstone of the club's Championship-winning teams of the 1970s and 1980s.

"Just look at Manchester United and the disrespectful things that were said about them a month or so ago. They turned things around. Liverpool can turn things around. Thompson told Thursday's Daily Telegraph.




