The Chinese Prime Minister appreciated Sheikh Hasina for her hard work as Prime Minister for socioeconomic development of Bangladesh during her rule.

"He and his party have been holding secret meetings to create a law and order situation." It said illegal arms might be recovered if they are placed on remand.

None dared to file any case against Selim as he was very powerful when he was an MP, it added.

The report also said three general diaries against Selim are pending with Lalbagh thana. Six cases including one under the Public Safety Act are also pending with Ramna, Lalbagh, Fatullah and Kamrangirchar thanas. Selim is facing charges of abduction, harassment of women, attempted murder and illegal trespass in the cases, the report said. Selim is on bail in all the six cases.

In his speech, Juctice Afzal said, "Groundwater arsenic contamination problem is no longer confined to only rural areas. Deep tubewells supplying water to many cities in the country are also contaminated."

"There is no alternative to surface water," Professor Dipankar Chakraborti, director of the SoES, Jadavpur University, Kolkata, West Bengal, said. "We still have time to shift to surface water. It would not cost much to motivate people to use water from ponds and wells.
