Mancini bids farewell

Roberto Mancini quit as coach of strife-torn Italian side Fiorentina on Friday, the club announced.

Mancini had already offered his resignation to president Vittorio Cecchi Gori earlier in the week following the team's 3-1 defeat at the hands of Perugia last weekend.

Mancini said he was quitting because he feared for his family's safety after he was approached and threatened by a group of supporters near his home late on Thursday.

"The fear of disturbance to my wife and my three children persuaded me that my work in Florence cannot continue." he said. Thursday had seen another day

of farce at the Florence club whose finances are in a mess and internal division splits the boardroom.

Earlier. the lawyer for Cecchi Gori's boardroom rival Luciano Luna announced that his client had

finally relented and signed the registration forms for the purchases for four players the coach wants to strengthen his team. But as usual there was a catch.

The lawyer, Aldo Capuano, revealed that the contracts - all on loan until the end of the season - will all be for the minimum wage possible under rules.

"I can confirm that Doctor Luna has just signed the forms for the acquisition of the following players -Adriano, (Anselmo) Robbiati, (Ivan) Tomic and (Sinisa) Mihajlovic," said

Capuano. "The acquisitions are on the basis of a free loan until June 30, 2002. Fiorentina has put down 51,645 euros (46,035 dollars) for each contract.

Before Luna's announcement 31-year-old Yugoslav international Mihajlovic, reportedly unhappy at

reports he would be paid a minimum wage, had returned to Lazio.

The Serb had started training with Fiorentina Wednesday before boycotting the afternoon session when Luna again scuppered the deal

Mancini had offered to resign on Monday but was persuaded to hold fire by film mogul Cecchi Gori who insisted the promised four players, whose signings had been vetoed by Luna last week, would arrive.

On Wednesday Luna again vetoed the moves and Mancini missed training Thursday as he headed to meet Cecchi Gori with the apparent intention to resign.

That was before Luna signed the forms - although with the threat of a minimum wage it remains to be seen if players on higher wages elsewhere will agree to join although it has been suggested their wages could be topped up by the selling clubs as all four are moving on loan until the end of the season.

Bolivia offers warm-ups AFP, La Paz

Bolivia will play friendlies against Brazil, Italy and Paraguay as their three opponents warm up for this year's World Cup finals, it was announced on Friday

Bolivia, who failed to qualify for the finals in Japan and South Korea after finishing seventh out of ten teams in the South American qualifying group, will first play Paraguay in Asuncion on February 12.

Nine days later Carlos Trucco's side face Brazil in Rio de Janeiro, with the Brazilians hoping to do better than their 3-1 defeat by the Bolivians in a qualifying match in November

Bolivia will then travel to Rome to face Italy on April 17.

"The Italians wanted to play against a South American team before the World Cup to help them prepare for their group match against Ecuador," said Bolivian federation spokesman Javier Silva.

REUTERS, London English soccer entered 2002 on a high, buoyed by the most exciting Premier League race in a decade and with the World Cup finals providing a warm background glow to counter the wintry weather.

However, headlines over the past few weeks have been dominated by the misdemeanours of players, managers and fans.

The problems have ranged from the serious - crowd violence - to the almost laughable - a fan banned for throwing a pie - but the sheer number of them has certainly dented the game's image.

Media over-reaction has not helped, with one newspaper describing a ground as a "Warzone" and another claiming that some of the crowd trouble was the worst seen for 30 years.

Such comments display a crass ignorance of the scale of the vio-

Hammam faced further criticism after it was revealed his personal bodyguard on his pitchside walk was a convicted soccer hooligan.
