If India were to move a resolution to declare Pakistan a terrorist state, how many would side with us? Let us be clear, when it comes to the reality, we have few supporters.


That is so because we are dirtydirty the way we run our politics and dirty the way we run our diplomatic relations.

There is pressure on GoB to export gas to India through pipeline, and the general public opinion is to cling on to the gas for home use.

If split into phases, it may be examined whether it is feasible to export gas through pipes to the nearest terminals, for example, first to Agartala, India; and then to Calcutta. The external PR (public relations) and goodwill would be enhanced to some extent between neighbours across the borders.

Banks under new strap

I refer to your lead story Banks under new strap: Fresh BB lending rule to hinder bank growth, industrialization, fears banking circle (Januarv 17).

I do not find any strength in the argument given by your reporter. We should not forget that banks take the deposits of small people and lend it to others. If their lending is diversified then the risk is lower. Moreover those who need very large loans should go to the capital market. Banks should not risk putting large loans into long term payoff. Usually this does not work as one may see in Thailand where the situation was further aggravated by foreign exchange risk. In any case let us not forget (i.e. export more gas). The two cities mentioned are very close to the borders, and the investment would be much less and most of the pipes would be within Bangladesh, widening the local network.
