

The inter-club cricketers' transfer for the Premier and First Division Cricket Leagues will be held over three days, starting from March 1.

The Cricket Committee of Dhaka Metropolitan (CCDM) in its adjourned meeting at the Bangabandhu National Stadium last night also unanimously decided that the leagues will begin from March 20.

The meeting also sought the Board decision over the relegation issue involving Lalmatia Club and Indira Road KC. Both were relegated from First Division last season, but the Board, in a controversial move, afterwards cancelled it.

The decision was again changed by Board's new president Ali Asghar on December 30. But the clubs want Asghar to review their plea to keep them in First Division.

Chaired by Khandar Jamiluddin, the meeting also decided to hold the three-day transfer for the Second and Third Division leagues from February 10. The leagues will start from February 28.

A source, preferring not to be named, revealed that all the 12 Premier Division and ten First Division clubs have asked for the Board donation to form their

Even those who spoke at the inaugural ceremony yesterday, called the stadium as 'Natore Stadium. LGED and co-operative deputy minister Advocate Ruhul Kuddus Talukdar Dulu inaugurated the cricket league while DC of Natore Sadar-Uddin Ahmed, DSA officials Aminul Haq, Nurul Ahsan Bakul and the district BNP general secretary Shahidul Islam Bachhu spoke on the occasion among

others. In January, 1997, former Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina had inaugurated the stadium and named it after valiant local freedom fighter and Awami League leader late Sankar Govinda Chowdhury.

The signboard on top of the stadium still reads ' Babu Sankar Govinda Chowdhury Stadium', but in recent times for all official correspondence and ceremonies, the only stadium in the district is being called as Natore Stadium.

Surprisingly, concerned officials failed to give any answer when asked whether the name of the stadium has been changed or not.

Eng hopes dealt a blow

6ICC U19 CRICKET WORLD CUP

England's chances of qualifying for the semifinals of the ICC Under-19s World Cup took a nosedive when tournament favourites Australia crushed them by 116 runs here Wednesday.

Another near-perfect performance from Australia saw England totally outplayed at Hagley Oval, and they must now beat South Africa on Friday, and hope New Zealand lose to Australia, in order to qualify for the last four.

England must beat South Africa comprehensively and pick up a bonus point to edge ahead of their rivals into second spot as their runrate is the poorest in the group. However, England scarcely

deserve a place in the last four after losing yet against to a Test-playing nation, and the fact their only wins in this competition have come against Nepal and Papua New Guinea gives a clear indication of their form.

A sloppy performance in the field, which saw three catches spilled, allowed Australia to post a commanding 281 for five from their 50 overs with 71 runs added in a disastrous final five overs for England George Bailey swiped 69 runs off 55 balls and Craig Simmons made 67 as Australia posted the highest score so far in Christchurch.

England needed to get off to a good start to stand any hope of victory but they lost opener Kadeer Ali with 28 on the board, and after his dismissal they lost wickets at regular intervals with only captain Nicky Peng (57) offering some resistance.

Left-arm spinner Beau Casson finished with 4-33 and Jarrad Burke 3-13 for Australia as England succumbed for 165. England manager James

Whittaker was clearly angered by his side's performance, but still held out some hope his side could make the semifinals "If we beat South Africa we stand a chance but to do that we will have

to raise our game considerably," he said. "South Africa are a reasonable side and we will have to improve in several areas. "We knew this would be a tough

game but I expected a little more resilience from us.

"We dropped three catches and I would have liked to have seen a little more fight in our middle-order. We will have to think guite hard about

the personnel in the team and decide who deserves to play on Friday. Also Wednesday, New Zealand

squandered the opportunity to seal their spot in the next round when they lost to South Africa by 24 runs. After narrowly defeating England at the start of the week New Zealand

went into the game full of confidence against a South African side recently mauled by Australia. New Zealand got off to a good start reducing their opponents to 85-4 but a fifth wicket stand worth 140

between Ryan Bailey (69) and David Jacobs (63) enabled South Africa to make 241 for seven. In reply, New Zealand looked comfortable at 88 for one but a mid-

innings collapse saw them slip to 191 for seven as the game turned South Africa's way. Four run outs hardly helped New Zealand's cause and they were bowled out for 217. On Thursday Super League

Group One will be decided by India's mouth-watering clash against Pakistan and Sri Lanka's clash with the West Indies. In the Plate Championship Bangladesh take on Zimbabwe and Papua New Guinea meet Kenya.

Ganguly drops Sehwag down

Hard-hitting Indian batsman Virender Sehwag will not find a place at the top of the order in the fifth one-day international against England here on Thursday despite his impressive performance in the previous game.

Despite smashing a 62-ball 82 as an opener to put his team on course for an eight-wicket victory in the fourth match at Kanpur on Monday, Sehwag will be replaced by an out-of-form skipper Sourav Ganguly. Sehwag rose to fame as an

opener with a 69-ball century - the seventh-fastest in one-dayers against New Zealand in a triangular series at Colombo last year. But he has yet to cement his place as an opener in the Indian

White, who scored a century in the second Test at Ahmedabad last month, however said he was unlikely to play in the remaining two matches.

"I will not play tomorrow," he said. "I joined the squad here because we are scheduled to leave for our tour of New Zealand after the last one-dayer at Bombay.

The sixth and last match will be played on Sunday.
