S'pore for integration of ASEAN economy to face China's threat

Southeast Asian countries must hasten economic integration if they want to compete with China, Singapore's Trade Minister George Yeo said Thursday

"China presents a huge challenge to Southeast Asia. If we do not move quickly to integrate ASEAN, we may be completely overshadowed by Northeast Asia," Yeo told a symposium on the ASEAN Free Trade Area (AFTA), which came into force on January 1.

Yeo called for the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) to reduce non-tariff barriers to trade, streamline customs procedures and push for liberalization of services.

"To strengthen our hand in the global game, we must broaden and deepen our economic integration. We should work towards the idea of an ASEAN Economic "Although much progress has been made, much

remains to be done. Six ASEAN members accounting for 96 per cent of regional trade -- Brunei, Indonesia, Malaysia, the Philippines, Singapore and Thailand -- have cut tariffs on

most regional trade to 0-5 per cent. ASEAN newcomers Vietnam, Laos, Myanmar and Cambodia are scheduled to reduce tariffs to no more than five per cent from 2006.

China's rapid economic growth will pose a threat to some sectors in ASEAN in the short term but will in the end benefit the region, Yeo said.

"China's prosperity will help bring prosperity to Southeast Asia. The (proposed) ASEAN-China Free Trade Area will give ASEAN preferential market access for ASEAN exports and investments into China," he said.

The investigative arm of Congress said Wednesday it would file suit against the administration of US President George W. Bush to obtain the release of documents about its energy program amid questions on the influence of companies such as Enron on the White House.

The General Accounting Office (GAO) "will take the steps necessary to file suit in the United States District Court" seeking access to records delineating the develop-

ment of the White House's energy policy by a task force headed by Vice President Dick Cheney.

The suit is the first action ever taken by the GAO to enforce its rights to access government documents, the agency said in a letter copied to President George W. Bush announcing its decision.

The White House has repeatedly refused to turn over documents related to the energy task force, insisting it would hamper the admin-

From Winston-Salem, North

Carolina, where Bush was touting his new volunteer corps, White House spokesman Ari Fleischer expressed confidence the administration would prevail in the federal suit and be able to keep documents originating in the closed door meetings from congressional review.

"The president will stand strong on principles," Fleischer said. "The White House will fight for its right in a court of law and the White House expects to prevail.'

On Thursday, dollar was steady against the major currencies not comforted much by the 0.2 rcent annualized growth US economy posted in the last quarter of 2001. The data surprised the analysts as they had been expecting a 1.0 percent annualized contraction for Q4. US Federal Reserve induced more trust in the economic recovery by leaving the Fed rate unchanged at its 40 year low of .75 percent, putting an end to the most aggressive rate cutting spree in history. Meanwhile, euro is still set on its downward journey, with no positive news on the economic front to boost the euroland Although yen lost a little ground against dollar at the Fed rate left unchanged and the flow of positive S economic data, comments from Japanese officials has stopped the currency from soaring further 1400 hrs on Thursday, euro traded at 0.8604/06 against dollar, pound stering at 1.4136/41 and n traded at 132.91/97 against US dollar.
