Garment worker Russia has long been supportive of Iraq, backing Saddam Hussein's murdered efforts to bring an end to UN sanctions imposed for its 1990 invasion in N'ganj Kuwait. Russia is also Iraq's leading trading partner. Iraq owes Russia about dlrs 7 billion, and a UNB, N'ganj new conflict could jeopardise repay-

"The United States is attempting to disrupt the existing economic relations of Russia with these countries and here is pursuing a purely commercial goal," said Konstantin Kosachev, deputy head of the defense committee in the State Duma, the lower house of the Russian parliament

Russia also has close ties with Iran, and has a dlrs 800 billion deal with Tehran to help complete the Bushehr nuclear power plant. The United States says Iran could use the technology to develop nuclear weapons, and has accused Russia of being a proliferator of weapons of mass destruction.

Putin forged close ties with North Korea last year during a rare visit to Russia by that country's reclusive leader, Kim Jong II. The two leaders signed a declaration pledging close consultations. Russia promised to help rebuild the North Korea economy, and both countries roundly criticised US plans for a national missile defense shield.

They also kidnapped Juba Sanghati leader Tanveer Haider Khan, Juba League general secretary Abu Hasan M Shaheed Badal and JP (E) leaders Kutubuddin and Jamaluddin. They later released them when police launched a hunt in the town.

Witnesses said the attack on Selim Osman, elder brother of former AL MP Shamim Osman, Tanveer, Badal, Kutubuddin, Jamaluddin and their associates was launched at about 11 am.

Selim and others appeared before the court in a case filed against them on charge of obstructing a Chittagong-bound long-march of the then opposition leader Khaleda Zia and ransacking the residence of Kishmat Hashem at Khanpur on June 9, 1998.

The attackers assaulted Selim and others, and kidnapped Tanveer, Badal, Kutubuddin and Jamaluddin.

As the news spread in the town. police raided different parts of the town, prompting the kidnappers to set the abducted people free. But they failed to arrest anyone in this connection.
