

Blasts during Shahriar's reception in Ctg kill one

A rickshaw-puller was killed and three others were injured in sniper bomb attacks in front of Chittagong Press Club in city's Jamal Khan area yesterday afternoon before and during a civic reception accorded to writer and journalist Shahriar Kabir.

According to police and eyewitnesses, about seven powerful bombs were exploded in the press club area at 2.40pm— before the civic reception— and while it was taking place. However, the reception that was held at the press club auditorium ended amid mounting tension.

Traffic movement in and round the press club remained suspended for three hours till 6.00pm.

Government to investigate AB flight fiasco

The government would investigate the entire episode of failure of the Air Bangladesh (AB) to carry Hajj pilgrims as it has 'cheated the pilgrims as well as the government', State Minister for Civil Aviation and Tourism Mir Nasiruddin said yesterday.

The Civil Aviation Authority of Bangladesh has permitted Air Bangladesh to fly the Hajj pilgrims to Saudi Arabia, says a late night ETV news bulletin. However, the first flight, scheduled to fly at 8:00pm yesterday, did not take off till 11:35pm, according to the ZIA flight enquiry.

"We are going to investigate the bungling by the AB." Action would also be taken against travel agents who sold tickets in advance and others concerned, he said at a press briefing at the Press Information

No end to pilgrims' woes

As many as 317 pilgrims at the Hajj Camp at Uttara in the city are waiting to be flown to Saudi Arabia.

The non-ballottee pilgrims do not know whether they will make it to this year's congregation after their tour operator, Air Bangladesh, was denied permission by the civil

aviation authorities to fly the Hajj pilgrims to the desert kingdom.

The pilgrims from greater Rajshahi region have been staying at the camp since January 26, as they were scheduled to start flying in batches from January 28.

At hostel No. 6 on the second floor of the spacious camp yesterday, Md. Abdul Aziz lay on the floor, his eyes closed.

When approached, the man from Naogaon said frustratingly, "In addition to other costs I paid my travel agent Tk 91,000 and I was supposed to fly in the morning of January 28. But in the morning, our group leader Mufti Azizul Islam broke the news that we are not flying as seats were not booked" said Aziz, from Naogaon who is tagged with a group of 73 pilgrims.

"I came here on the night of January 26 from Naogaon with very little money since we were supposed to stay for only two days at the camp. In fact, most of us have run out of money," said a dejected-looking Israk Ali Dewan who was staying at

Chaos rules JS session

The Jatiya Sangsad session was in disorder for sometime yesterday as several treasury bench members, including three ministers, gave the speaker a tough time when debating the issues relating to point of order.

Communications Minister Nazmul Huda blasted Speaker Jamiruddin Sircar for "compelling him to become disorderly", as the minister was denied the floor despite repeated systematic attempts.

"I pressed the button but you did not respond. I raised my hand but you ignored. And you have given me the floor only after I rose to my feet and shouted," an angry Huda said apparently to ridicule the chair.

Referring to the non-practising method of seeking the floor by pressing button on the desk, the minister asked the speaker if the button system was at all working. "I had to fight a battle to draw your attention... we, the members of parliament, are supposed to be civilised people."

UZ system to be reintroduced

The differences of opinion on Upazila system in the relevant cabinet committee ended yesterday as it unanimously decided to reintroduce this local government tier soon.

Sources said two members of the six-strong cabinet committee, who were opposing Upazila system, finally agreed that Upazila system should be reintroduced to fulfil BNP's election commitment as well as further strengthen the local government system.

The unanimous decision was taken at the 5th meeting of the committee held at the Secretariat with committee chairman and LGRD and Cooperatives Minister Abdul Mannan Bhuiyan in the chair.

The meeting was attended by committee members Law Minister Moudud Ahmed, Communications Minister Nazmul Huda, Industries Minister MK Anwar and Information Minister Dr Abdul Moyeen Khan. The

The opposition leader also termed the prime minister's offer made in her over-the-air address to the nation on Monday "vague".

Asked whether she would make any suggestion to the government, Hasina instantly said, "Stop repression on the opposition leaders and activists and the religious minorities and this is my first suggestion to the government."

Hasina gave sector-wise analysis of Monday's speech by Khaleda Zia and described it as fabricated, while she was speaking at the press conference at the Jatiya Press Club in the afternoon.

At the press conference were present AL Presidium Members Abdus Samad Azad and Amir Hossain Amu and AL Secretary General Zillur Rahman, among others.

Osmany Udyan turns into a thriving place for sex workers and drug peddlers as night descends

With darkness creeping up on the city's Osmany Udyan, a dozen of female sex workers emerge from the shadowy corners of the park. Some are adults and some too young, but most look frail and run-down. Pimps and vagabonds move in and out of the shady nook in the northeastern part of the parkland. Some sit under the trees and take puffs on various drugs. Some policemen armed with 303 rifles move around chattering among themselves, completely oblivious to the trades in the darkness.

The park is home to dozens of sex workers, pimps and drug addicts, who live under trees, sometimes erecting shacks made of polythene sheets and sharing them with friends and families. Eyes blood-shot and clothes tattered, the tired-
