

### Harun felt the ban

The FIFA ban on Bangladesh Football Federation (BFF) has not only tarnished the image of the country but the effects of the damage could be felt in the future also...

BFF general secretary Harunur Rashid made this observation during an unscheduled press conference at the BFF office yesterday.

Harun who returned home along with the three-member Bangladesh delegation from Malaysia yesterday morning after pleading the country's case to the Asian Football Confederation (AFC), also hoped that FIFA, which suspended Bangladesh from international football on January 9 following the government's decision to dissolve the BFF's elected committee and install an ad-hoc body in December, would lift the ban immediately.

"The suspension has brought a bad name for the country. It has given the football world the chance to catagorise Bangladesh as a

problematic member," said Harun. He added that Bangladesh have three members in different subcommittees of AFC but none of them have been included in any subcommittee for the 2002 World Cup due to the ban.

"FIFA has excluded candidates from Bangladesh, Nepal and Lebanon from their many committees which will be active for 50 days during the World Cup. This is solely because these countries have faced FIFA suspensions," Harun revealed.

"I don't know how long it would take before everything returns to normal," said a visibly worried

Harun also spoke of the ignominy he experienced because of Bangladesh's present status.

"I was sitting outside the meeting room where the AFC's executive committee met to discuss Bangladesh's fate. I wasn't allowed

inside and felt like an orphan. It was absolutely disgraceful.

'However, I forgot everything when the executive body members came out and told me that they would make the recommendation to FIFA about Bangladesh," Harun

The BFF general secretary also informed that the AFC was scheduled to send their fax in this regard to FIFA yesterday.

The suspension was imposed by the emergency committee of FIFA. Hopefully it would revoke its decision following the AFC proposal without much delay," Harun said.

About the possibilities of hosting the South Asian Football Federation (SAFF) championship which had to be postponed because of the ban, Harun said he had discussions with AFC Marketing Limited (AML), the sponsors of the meet.

"They have informed me that they would ask South Asian Football Federation (SAFF) to convene a meeting soon on the issue," said
