England start wrongly

Simon Doull was an unlikely hero as he carved up England's bowlers to lead Northern Districts to a thrilling three-wicket victory over the tourists here Friday.

Doull, who averaged just 11.57 from 75 previous domestic one-dayers, played 80 off 47 balls in front of 3,000 spectators in the tour opening day-night match.

It was the kick-start Northern needed before a cool-headed Michael Parlane's 79 helped the home side to their target of 289 with five balls to spare.

England's total of 288 for six, including a rapid 126 from opener Nick Knight, had seemed more than enough to begin their eight-week tour with a win.

No more Nepal surprise

ICC U19 CRICKET WORLD CUP NEW ZEALAND 2002

A century from 16-year-old Zimbabwean Brendon Taylor helped end Nepal's fairytale ICC Under-19s World Cup campaign in the final of the Plate Championship on Friday.

A clinical performance from Zimbabwe saw them secure victory by 137 runs with Taylor scoring an unbeaten 100, the first century in Christchurch during this competition.

Taylor, who celebrated his 16th birthday on Wednesday, batted the entire 50 overs as Zimbabwe made 247 for one on a slow pitch, with Charles Coventry (64) and captain Tatenda Taibu (65), who was later named player of the tournament, both registering half-centuries.

Nepal looked jaded after a hectic week which has seen them in action for the past three days with their rain interrupted semi-final clash against Bangladesh running into Thursday.

Zimbabwe's total was always going to be tough for Nepal, whose weakness throughout the competition has been scoring runs quickly, and they were dismissed for just 110

with more than 15 overs to spare.

It was a cruel end to what has been a wonderful tournament for Nepal, who return home having lost just twice in eight matches and beaten two Test playing nations in Pakistan and Bangladesh.

"Winning the toss was crucial and the opening partnership set it up for us," said Zimbabwe coach Steve Rhodes.

The final of the main competition takes place on Saturday with Australia meeting South Africa at the Bert Sutcliffe Oval.

knew they were well off the pace should the game be curtailed.

At the start of the innings, South African skipper Shaun Pollock and Makhaya Ntini bowled two maiden overs each, and it was not until the second ball of the fifth over that Lou Vincent got his team off the mark.

No sooner had they got going than Nathan Astle (7) and Andre Adams (1) departed in quick succession to loose shots.

Only when the dark clouds started to gather did Black Caps' captain Stephen Fleming (17 off 17) decide it was time to lift the run rate.

Vincent, who had taken 13 balls to open his account, hit 43 off his next 29 balls with a succession of powerful pull shots.

At one point, Fleming and Vincent hit 36 runs from three overs - including 25 off a pair of Ntini overs.

Vincent smashed successive sixes, off Pollock and Ntini, both shots sailing over long-on, and added five fours in an entertaining knock.

But, panicked by the need to score quickly after such an abysmal start, the New Zealanders overdid the aggression and lost three wickets for four runs before dangerous lightning, followed by rain, sent players scurrying for shelter.

Once play resumed, Chris Cairns and Chris Harris added 75 runs in 115 balls, pushing New Zealand towards a respectable score.

But the Kiwis lost two wickets in as many balls in the 35th over, Lance Klusener's sixth.

Klusener had Harris (31) trapped lbw and with his next ball, a slow off-cutter, and then induced a lofted shot from Adam Parore, who was caught at midwicket for a first-ball duck.

Two overs later, it was Allan Donald (3-29) who was on a hat-trick after he earned lbw decisions against Daniel Vettori (3) and James Franklin (0), but Shane Bond survived the hat-trick ball.

Running out of partners, Cairns decided to attack and brought up his half-century off 68 balls before he was caught at long-on for 57, Nicky Boje taking the catch to give Jacques Kallis his third wicket.
