# Dhaka jive with Jahangir

In-form Jahangir Alam blasted yet another cracking half-century as Dhaka posted their sixth win to consolidate their claim for the Ispahani National Cricket League title yesterday.

The former national opener smashed 79 off just 30 balls as the hosts, needing 203 in the second innings to win on the final day against Rajshahi, raced to 206 in just 41.1 overs with seven wickets in hand at the Mymensingh Stadium.

With that seven-wicket win. Dhaka almost confirmed the championship by raising their tally to 36 points from seven matches, 16 ahead of the second-placed Raishahi, who have earned 20 points playing in six matches.

Dhaka now need only a win from their remaining three matches.

Coming in to bat at number three, Jahangir lost two partners -- Sajjad Ahmed (39) and Rafique (1) -quickly. But that did not deter the determination of Jahangir as he went on to plunder 103 runs for the undefeated fourth wicket with former national captain Aminul Islam, whose contribution was only 14. With this 79 not out, Jahangir became the second highest rungetter (462 runs) in the League after former national captain and Chittagong mainstay Minhazul Abedin, who has scored 780 runs so

Opener Rashedul Haq however gave Dhaka a solid start with a 72ball 54 that included a couple of sixes and four boundaries.

Together with Sajjad, Rashed put on 102 for the opening stand before being bowled by Nuruzzaman in the 23rd over of the day.

# Waqar the wrecker

Pakistani captain Waqar Younis grabbed 4-44 on his way to joining the 350-wicket club to lead a 244-run rout of the West Indies in the second cricket Test here on Sunday.

Set an improbable victory target of 434, the West Indians paid for poor batting and two dubious umpiring decisions to be shot out for 189 at the stroke of stumps on the fourth Pakistan, who won the first Test

by 170 runs, swept the two-match series that was shifted to this desert venue after the West Indies declined to play in Pakistan due to security Waqar, the 78-Test veteran paceman, ended the series with 352

wickets, becoming the third Pakistani after Wasim Akram (414) and Imran Khan (362) to reach the landmark. All-rounder Abdur Razzaq chipped in with 3-33 as the beleaguered West Indies lost their last five

wickets for 28 runs to crash to a 23rd defeat in their last 27 overseas Tests. Pakistan, enjoying a first innings lead of 208, made 225-5 in their second knock when Wagar declared three overs after lunch.

In the absence of three top batsmen, including the injured Brian Lara, few expected the West Indies to set a world record and successfully chase the fourth innings target The highest a team has scored
