### Sanskrit & Pali exams results published

## Liver transplantation now possible in Bangladesh

UNB, Dhaka

In a breakthrough in health services, surgeons are poised to make liver transplantation, the most complicated surgery on human body, possible in the country.

"We are developing specialised surgeons and skilled manpower to go for hepatobiliary surgery, including liver transplantation within a year or less," Dr Zulfiqur Khan of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujib Medical University told UNB yesterday.

Liver transplantation is the only treatment option for liver failure and liver cirrhosis, and the

hepatobiliary surgeon said they were going to start a new wing. Hepatobiliary surgery, in the hospital.

The university is collecting expensive and sophisticated operation equipment like CUSA and Intra-operative Ultra Sound to set another landmark in medical treatment at home.

He observed that many are going abroad - Singapore and India in particular for the treatment of liver diseases. "But now we are capable of dealing with such diseases here," said the surgeon, who is an FRCS.

About the availability of livers for grafting, he said liver can be collected from a body within 24 hours of a person's death and a health person also can donate liver to his close relative.

In Singapore will cost Tk 50 lakh. "But in our country it will cost nearly Tk 5 lakh. It takes 12 to 16 hours to complete the liver transplantation."

He observed that many are going abroad - Singapore and India in particular for the treatment of liver diseases. "But now we are capable of dealing with such diseases here," said the surgeon, who is an FRCS.

About the availability of livers for grafting, he said liver can be collected from a body within 24 hours of a person's death and a health person also can donate liver to his close relative.

## Rescued children need proper rehabilitation in society

The children rescued from the traffickers are in dire need of proper rehabilitation as well as integration in society.

"These rescued children have been living in an inhuman condition at different childcare homes, including government ones which lacked sufficient food, educational and medical facilities, recreation, security and some other physical and mental problems," Prof. Bur Galaway, an expert on children rehabilitation observed at a function in the city yesterday.

Prof. Galaway was sharing his experiences on rehabilitation of trafficked children with different stakeholders related with organisations in their rehabilitation at Bangladesh Institute of Advanced and Management (BIAM) after a month-long visits to a number of childcare centres in the country.

"The childcare centers I have visited in one month across the country lacked adequate facilities to live in," he said.

We need to develop the standard of institutions supported by proper law for ensuring the guardianship of rescued children to have access to residential facilities, he said. He emphasised on community based programme to create awareness among the guardians, specially poorer for integration of the rescued children in society.

Referring to the rehabilitation of rescued girl children who were reportedly violated by the traffickers, Galaway said psychosocial problem is the main barrier in their rehabilitation.

He said NGOs could play a vital role in this regard by taking programmes like education and income generating projects as the rescued children are not prepared to face such crises.

Some stakeholders blamed poverty as the main cause for trafficking as most of them converged to urban areas for better living standard.

They also suggested the officials related to the CPCCT project to make changes in the programme considering the poverty issue.
