Paddy procurement drive faces setback in Jhenidah

Food procurement drive faces setback in Jhenidah.
Only 61 metric tonnes of paddy and 1959 MT of rice have been procured instead of its target of 2448 and 3274 MT respectively.
Price-hike of paddy and rice is reason of this situation, said a source related to the food department.
The procurement rate of each kilogram of paddy and rice was fixed as Tk 8 and 12.50 respectively. But the farmers are getting fair price of their produce in open market. So they feel discouraged to supply paddy or rice to government food stores.
In Jhenidah Sadar 15 MT of paddy instead of the target of 564 MT of paddy and 1561MT of rice instead of

the target of 1891 MT of rice, have been procured.
No paddy have been procured from Sailkupa, Harinakundu, Kaliganj and Kotchandpur upazilas where the procurement targets have been fixed at 384, 213, 486 and 145 MT respectively. Only 46 MT of paddy have been procured from Mohespur in stead of the target of 656 MT.
No rice has been procured from both Sailkupa and Harinakundu upazilas although the target have been 298 MTs and 213 MTs respectively. Only 108 MT of rice have been procured from Kaliganj instead of the target of 187 MT, 156 MT instead of the target of 272 mt in Kotchandpur and 134 MT instead of the target of 413 MT in Mohespur.
A source related to the Food

Department said, the procurement drive aims at ensuring fair price of foodgrains to the producers.
Abdul Malek, 41, Sudhangshu Sekhar, 35, both the farmers when asked about the drive at Bishoykhali bazar they said to this correspondent, supply of paddy and rice to government stores is a troublesome affair.
Furthermore, delay in payment also causes farmers' sufferings. As a result, most farmers do not feel encouraged to supply foodgrains in the government stores, they informed.

Prices of essentials soar in Gopalganj, Bheramara

Prices of essential commodities have shot up abnormally in Gopalganj, Bheramara and its

adjoining areas causing great inconvenience to the poor and low-income group people.
Our Gopalganj correspondent reports: Prices of essential commodities like rice, pulses, soyabean oil and kerosene oil have gone up in Gopalganj hitting the fixed income groups.
Markets sources said, prices of different varieties of rice have shot up on average by Tk 4 to 5 per kilogram. One kilogram of medium quality of rice is being sold at 17, but earlier it was being sold at Tk 13.
While talking to Humayun Mia, a rice trader of the old market in Gopalganj town, he told The Daily Star correspondent that paddy prices have also increased throughout different markets of Gopalganj. As a result rice prices have gone up in the markets.
Pulse is being sold between Tk 37 to 38 per kilogram in the markets. Earlier, 'masur' pulse was sold between Tk 33 to 34 per kg.
Now soyabean oil is being sold between Tk 38 to 39 per kilogram in the markets. But earlier it was sold between Tk 30 to 32 per kg.
Kerosene oil is being sold between Tk 20 to 21 per litre in the markets. Earlier, kerosene oil was sold between Tk 13 to 14 per litre.
While talking to Badrul Mia, a shop owner at the New Municipal

Market in Gopalganj town, he told this correspondent that presently they have been purchasing rice, pulse, soyabean and kerosene oil at high prices from the wholesale market. For this reason they are selling those at high rates.
Such price-like of essentials has hit hard the common people, particularly belonging to the low-income groups.
People of fixed income groups are now counting additional money for food.
Local people have urged to authority concerned to take necessary steps immediately to bring down prices of essential commodities.
BSS reports from Bheramara: A section of unscrupulous traders have manipulated the prices of essentials to get extra profit. In different hats and bazaars of the upazila, prices of rice, fish and wheat have gone up.
Per kg onion is now selling at Tk 60 against the previous price of Tk 40, pulses now being sold at Tk 40-45 against Tk 30. Soybean oil at Tk 44 against Tk 38, green chili at Tk 30 against the previous price of Tk 20.
Inhabitants of the areas alleged that the authorities concerned are indifferent to take action against these unscrupulous traders.
