Body of unidentified woman recovered

UNB, Manikganj

Police recovered the body of an unidentified woman from a canal behind a godown at Mohadebpur in Shibbalaya upazila of Manikganj on Sunday.

The body of the woman aged about 30 years bore marks of injury. Police suspect that miscreants killed her after rape and later dumped the body into the canal. Another report adds: Sixteen people were injured in a clash between two rival groups of villagers over occupying a house at Chatlili village in Saturia upazila on the same day. Of the injured, Manikjan, 45, Kamaljan, 50, Sonamia, 40, Ershad, 17, and Shahid, 25, were admitted to the Sadar Hospital in critical condition.

Housewife killed in road accident

A housewife was killed and 18 other people were injured in separate road accidents on Dhaka-Aricha highway Sunday.

Sonaburi, 60, wife of Ahmed Ali of Dusharia village in Harirampur upazila in Manikganj, died on the spot when a speeding bus ran over her near Tebra bus stand. In another incident, 18 passengers of 'Nosimari', a local three-wheeler vehicle, were injured when the driver of their vehicle lost control and fell it into a ditch at Nokhanda. On them, critically injured, Bishwa Rani, 30, Puti Rani, 25, Salam, 15, Thandu, 23, Rokman, 25, and Chhabbi, 25, were admitted to Sadar Hospital.

51 Mongla Port workers go on retirement

Fifty-one workers of Mongla Port went on voluntary retirement on Sunday under the golden handshake programme of the port authorities.

The port chairman handed over cheques of Tk 7.65 lakh to them in the evening. The benefit received by the retired workers ranged from 15 to 40 thousand taka. Sources said 381 more workers are in the retirement list. A total of 426 workers were sent to retirement under the golden handshake programme last year.

JP (Manju) leader injured by miscreants

A local leader of Jatiya Party (Manju) was injured after a group of miscreants beat him up mercilessly at Chhoto Koibarta village of Rajapur upazila of Jhalakati on Friday night.

Family sources said M Elias, who is also member of Galua Union Parishad had been hiding since the October 1 general election on apprehension of being attacked by local BNP supporters. But on that night, the miscreants swooped on him, beat him mercilessly and broke one of his legs. He was admitted to Pirojpur Sadar Hospital.

23 abducted in Kushtia in four months

Incidents of abduction for realising ransom increased alarmingly following deterioration of the law and order in Kushtia in four months till January this year.

According to newspaper reports, at least 23 people were abducted in six upazilas of the district since October 30 last year till the end of January this year. Of the total, five people were killed while some others tortured because of realising money from their families.

Some identified organised gangs remained involved in such abduction incidents in Kushtia. But the law enforcers were yet to take stern measures against the culprits to save the innocent people from their clutches, local people observed.

When contacted with the top police official of the district, he said to this correspondent that the law and order in Kushtia was up to the mark despite some sporadic incidents of abduction.

According to records, a total of 18 incidents of kidnapping took place in 1999 while the number was 28 in 1998.

Among the victims, Nazmul, 20, son of Biswas was abducted at gunpoint in early October and he was released following payment of Tk 1 lakh as ransom on October 5.

Babul, 21, another victim was abducted and released after payment of Tk 1 lakh.

A college student Babu, 23, was abducted by "Mander Bahini" and he was released after payment of Tk 2 lakh on October 16. The miscreants kidnapped Enamul Haq on October 24.

Police admitted about the incident, but the victim remained untraced since then.

Karim Mondal, 27 was abducted on way home and he was released after payment of Tk 60,000 on the last day of October.

In another incident, Faruq, 20, was abducted for ransom and released after payment of Tk 1 lakh.

Siddiq, 29, was abducted from his Mirpur upazila residence and released after payment of Tk 1.5 on November 13.

1,446 crimes recorded in Netrakona last year

A total of 1,446 cases of various crimes were filed in 10 upazilas of Netrakona in 2001, police sources said.

Of those, killings -53, rapes-57, armed robberies-7, acid attacks-4, woman repressions-94, child repressions-3, abductions-9, attack on police-1, burglary-47, cow lifting-30,

A housewife named Ratan was kidnapped and killed by a gang of terrorists and murdered after being raped on November 18.

Ataur, a businessman was abducted on November 19 and released on 22 the same month after payment of Tk 2 lakh.

Jabed Mondal and two sons Sariful and Shafiqul both school students were abducted and released after payment of Tk 2 lakh on November 27.

On the same day Kafil and Lalon were also abducted by "Mander Bahini" and released after payment of ransom money.

Jalal Uddin, a schoolteacher was kidnapped from Daulatpur, and released after payment of Tk 1 lakh on November 22.

On the same day Sanjib, 45, and his two sons Uttam, 22 and Krisno, 28, were abducted and released after payment of Tk 2 lakh on December 8.

Abductors kidnapped Asaduzzaman Bhutto, 30, on December 12 and his body was recovered on the following day.

An egg trader Syed Ali was abducted on December 23 along with Tk 90,000 and he was released after payment of additional money amounting to Tk 1.50 lakh.

A local contractor Latif was abducted by a gang of abductors on December 26. His severed head was found on the following day from the Mojampura area. Sohel Rana, 25, was abducted from his village at Ziarok in Sadar upazila on January 28. Abductors demanded Tk 1 lakh as ransom, but his father failed to provide the money. Ultimately he was chopped to death by the abductors.

Families of the victims did not file any case in fear of reprisal by the criminals.

The trend of abduction is still continuing and people of the area feel insecure.

Contractors lock up WDB chief engineer's office in Rangpur

Hundreds of contractors of Water Development Board (WDB) on Monday staged a demonstration and laid siege to the office of the chief engineer and other engineers of WDB, Rangpur in demand of their arrear bills amounting to Tk 20

crores.

The demonstrating contractors also locked all the offices of WDB in the district town.

President of WDB contractors' Welfare Association Lokman Hossain Mondal and Secretary Amirul Huq Khokan alleged that all the contractors WDB did not get the bills of their work which completed in 1999-2000. Instead of sanctioning fund for the on-going projects, the present government diverted fund elsewhere, alleged the WDB contractors' leaders.

They demanded immediate sanction of required funds for payment of their outstanding bills.

When this correspondent contacted the WDB chief engineer, he told that he already faxed to higher authorities in this regard.

Cocktails hurled at CU teachers' bus

Two cocktails were hurled at a teachers' bus of Chittagong University (CU) in Bajit Bostami area of the city on Thursday.

Police said, a group of students allegedly belonging to Chhatra League hurled the cocktails at the bus carrying some teachers to the campus.

The bus was partially damaged and there was no report of injury.

The authorities of the CU filed a case with Khulsi police station on Thursday night in this connection.

Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) imposed an indefinite strike on CU campus since November 3 to press home their demands which include punishment to the killers of its senior vice-president Ali Murtoza and arrest of those responsible for campus violence on the day.
