MDC which its members nickname 'Mummy, Daddy, Children' includes everybody.

Holland's party has submitted a statement to the Commonwealth listing the allegations against the Mugabe government, including rape, torture and murder of MDC supporters.

"You see if Mugabe steals the elections then at least CMAG will already know that we have appealed for suspension. If we don't ask for suspension we will have to wait another two years when the Commonwealth will meet again.'

Holland alleges that she herself has been the target of repression. There were five attempts to kill the MDC presidential candidate, she
