People will respond to hartal call spontaneously, says Zillur

UNB, Dhaka

Awami League general secretary Zillur Rahman MP said people would spontaneously respond to the hartal call today to ventilate their anger and protest against the repressive and corrupt rulers.

"We firmly believe that the hartal will be successful, people will observe it spontaneously," he told UNB over phone on the eve of day-long strike called by the Awami League.

Zillur said Awami League did not campaign for today's hartal but only made an appeal to the people to observe the hartal.

"We feel the people will observe the hartal voluntarily throughout the country as they have become victims of repression and torture in the last six months," he said.

In reply to a question, he said Awami League would not resort to picketing for enforcing shutdown, but "I will request the people to voluntarily join the strike to register their protest against misdeeds and misrule of the BNP-Jamaat regime."
