Five sued for killing businessman

**UNB, Laxmipur**  
Five people have been sued for Saturday's killing of a businessman at Khilbaicha Bhuiyarthat village at Sadar upazila in Laxmipur.  
The wife of the victim, Khurshida Begum, filed the murder case Saturday night against BNP activists Tuhin, Ismail Hossain Ratan, Shibal, Shawkat Manik and Abu. However, police could not arrest anyone. Trader Abdul Mannan, also a BNP supporter, was killed by unknown miscreants at Bhuiyarthat bazaar on Saturday.

Bomb hurled on housewife in Barisal

A middle aged housewife was injured critically as miscreants hurled a bomb on her at Adhuna village at Gouranadi upazila in Barisal on Saturday.  
Family sources said the miscreants threw the bomb on Shikha Rani Datta, 40, wife Shankar Datta, while she was working at the veranda of her house. The bomb blew up the wrist of her right hand. She was admitted to Barisal Sher-e-Bangla Medical College Hospital in a critical condition.

Health Day observed in Khulna

World Health Day was observed in Khulna on Sunday in a befitting manner.  
Acting Civil Surgeon Dr Daud Ali Meer inaugurated the day's programme at Shaheed Hadis Park in the morning. A colourful rally was brought out from the park. A team of Detective Branch Police challenged two youths moving suspiciously in the area and recovered the explosives from one of them identified as Samaul. Police arrested Samaul, but his accomplice, Murad, managed to escape. A case was filed with sadar thana.

Work on academic buildings of college goes on

Academic buildings of six educational institutions are being constructed in Chapainawabganj at a cost of Tk 1.42 crore.  
Facilities Department of Education Ministry is implementing the project with the financial assistance from the Asian Development Bank (ADB). The buildings are being constructed for a college, a madrasa and four high schools. The work is expected to be completed by June next, official sources said.

Indiscriminate catching of fries on in Bheramara

Fries of different species of fishes are being caught indiscriminately by the unscrupulous fishermen and villagers with current nets defying the government ban on catching small and under size fish and fries.  
As a result, the prospect of fish breeding in this areas is being hampered drastically. Current nets are being used indiscriminately in different beels (water bodies) and rivers in Bheramara upazila and its adjacent areas. Under-seize fishes are also being sold openly in different markets. No steps have yet been taken by the authorities concerned, local people alleged.

Alleged rapist arrested in Sirajganj

Police arrested a youth from Kadampal village in Sadar upazila Thursday night in connection with an alleged raping of a girl.  
Police said Abdul Halim, 24, of Baroibagh village in Royganj upazila, allegedly raped his next-door-neighbour January 23. Locals caught Halim red-handed but he was snatched away by his associates. Later, he went into hiding. Earlier, the victim filed a case with the police in this regard on the following day.

Pediatricians needed to treat child patients

Treatment of the child patients is seriously being hampered due to absence of pediatricians in Chuadanga.  
Hospital sources said a sizable number of child-patients visit sadar hospital everyday with complications of pneumonia, septicemia and meningitis. At present 21 child patients have been undergoing treatment in the hospital. Of them, conditions of 20 are said to be critical. But there is no child specialist in the hospital. Common MBBS doctors are treating the patients. Two children Rabbi and Shariful died of complication of their diseases on

Four alleged rapists of little girl nabbed from Bagmara

Bagmara Police initially tried to conceal the rape incident of a seven-year-old girl at Konda village in Bagmara upazila in Rajshahi.  
One week after the brutal incident police arrested all the four alleged rapists who were roaming openly in the village. Bagmara Police acted after being directed by the higher authorities.  
The investigating authorities refrained from taking any action until the matter drew attention of the local journalists.  
Rajab Ali, father of the victim girl delayed to file the case with the concerned police station apprehending harassment and further attacks.  
He, however, lodged the case on March 31 accusing four culprits.  
But police refrained from arresting the accused persons because of their political identity, it was alleged.  
They first arrested the principal accused, Ashraful Alam on Thursday when they perceived that the incident would draw the attention of local journalists. By Friday night, Bagmara police managed to nab all the four accused.  
On March 21, four cadres of the ruling BNP's front organisation Jubo Dal entered into the house of Rajab

by breaking open the door and raped the seven-year-old girl in front of her brother. They also cut a portion of her sexual organ with a sharp weapon.  
The victim, a student of class three at BRAC School in Bagmara and daughter of an Awami League (AL) worker Rajob Ali is undergoing treatment at Rajshahi Medical College Hospital (RMCH).  
The incident was brought to public when the girl was admitted to RMCH on April 5 following deterioration of her physical condition.  
While talking to this correspondent a number of villagers claimed that the incident occurred as a sequel to political rivalry.  
Since last October election, at least 40 'identified' families belonging to AL at Konda village have been facing harassment of various nature, said a villager preferring anonymity.

Ali, father of the girl alleged before the journalists that associates of the accused were now threatening him to withdraw the case and to leave the village. So, they were feeling insecure at the hospital.  
On April 4, some of the BNP workers chased Ali and his nephew Feroz out of the village. Police on Saturday set up a temporary camp before the house of Ali to ensure security of their life.

Storm damages 30pc standing wheat in Thakurgaon

The hopes of the farmers in Thakurgaon have been shattered following a violent storm that lashed the district on April 2, damaging standing crops, including wheat, on a vast tract of land.  
Department of Agriculture Extension (DAE) sources said the storm accompanied by hails damaged up to 30 per cent standing wheat in sadar upazila.  
The Agriculture Officer of Ranishongkoi upazila said various crops, including wheat and watermelon, were damaged in the storm at Nonduar, Nekmorod.

Dharmagarh and Kashipur unions in the upazila.  
The other worst effected upazilas are Haripur, Pirganj and Baliadangi.  
DAE fixed a target to bring 63,000 hectares of land under wheat cultivation this season with an output target of 2 lakh metric tons of wheat.  
But the farmers cultivated wheat on 70,000 hectares of land exceeding the target.  
DAE sources said the farmers of the affected areas are harvesting at least 30 per cent less wheat per acre compared to the previous years following the storm.

Three alleged rapists held in Rajshahi

Three alleged rapists were arrested at village Konda in Bagmara upazila of Rajshahi on Saturday.  
The arrested persons were identified as Ashraful Islam, 26, Abdur Rahim, 30, and Moka, 27.  
According to police, one little girl was gang-raped at Konda village by four local miscreants of the same village recently. The girl is now undergoing treatment at Rajshahi Medical College Hospital.  
A case was recorded with Bagmara thana.

Betel leaf growers face manifold problems

Betel leaf growers in three upazilas in Narail have been facing manifold problems.  
Dearth of inputs, high rates of carrying costs, crisis of loan and marketing facilities, insufficient rain and natural calamities like drought, cyclone, flood are main causes behind the setback of betel leaf cultivation in Narail Sadar, Lohagora and Kalia upazila. Betel leaves produced in these areas are large in size.  
According to the Department of Agricultural Extension (DAE) sources, betel leaf fields in these areas have become less in number

following abnormal price hike of raw materials during the last few years.  
Besides, the cost of cultivation materials of betel leaves like straw, bamboo, jute stick, oil cake, pesticides, wire and labour charges have gone up in recent years.  
About 40 maunds of oil cakes are required for one bigha of cultivable land for betel leaf. Bamboo frame used for plantation of betel leaf are required to be changed frequently, but it is impossible for the farmers because of high cost of bamboo which sells at Tk 100 to Tk 120 per pieces.  
Most of the betel leaves produced in these areas are exported to various Asian, Arabian and

Middle Eastern countries.  
Meanwhile, due to drastic fall in demand of betel leaf in domestic markets and lack of district export facilities many of the growers have given up their traditional profession.  
On the other hand, the conditions of betel leaf farmers are very miserable. They could not cope with the production and the selling price of these. At present, about 20 families of these areas have been facing miseries.  
When contacted, some betel leaf growers told that the prices of inputs such as straw, bamboo, fixture, coir, oil cake, fertilisers and jute sticks have increased abnormally.
